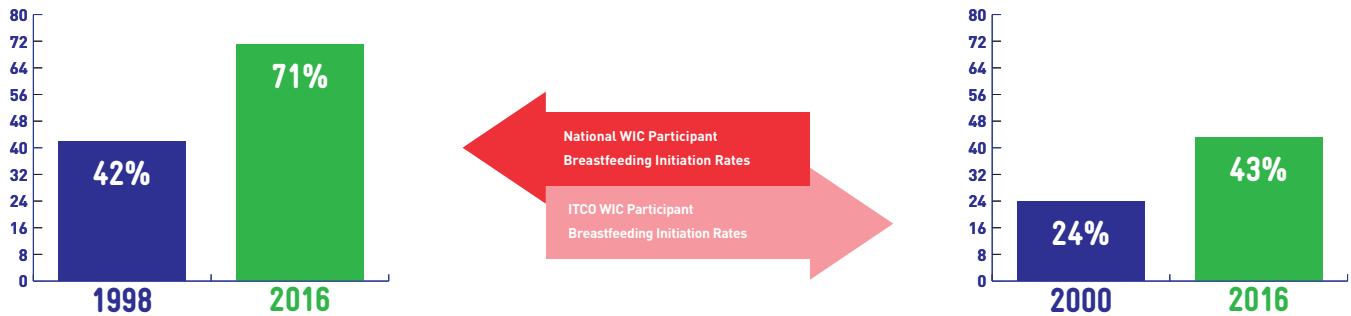
WIC IS EFFICIENT

EBT STATUS

Inter-Tribal Council of Oklahoma has implemented WIC EBT/eWIC statewide. All state WIC programs must transition from paper vouchers to electronic benefit transfer cards (EBT) by 2020.
