### DAY 1

On the first day of the trip, meet your Backroads Trip Leaders (the folks in Backroads T-shirts) at 11:15 a.m. outside the St-Jean train station in Bordeaux, France. Please arrive dressed in your biking clothes (or have them handy so you can change before the ride) and bring your luggage and a daypack with your rain gear and anything else you may want for today's ride (your luggage will be transported to our first night's accommodations).



Bienvenue! Welcome to the Dordogne! After meeting we shuttle to the charming village of Pontours, where your Backroads Trip Leaders fit your bike and give a brief talk on biking techniques and safety. We begin our week on two wheels heading east on picturesque country roads, passing by walnut groves and tobacco fields, and through the bastide town of Molières. It's the perfect introduction to this part of France, a region steeped in charm, mystique and history.

After perhaps stopping for *un café* in town, continue riding past the ruins of a 13th-century castle and along treelined roads before crossing over the Dordogne River to our hotel. Our home for the first two nights, Le Vieux Logis, is nestled in the beautiful village of Trémolat. Feel free to cool off in the hotel's limestone pool or stroll through the gardens.

Tonight we toast to the week ahead before enjoying a relaxed dinner at nearby Le Bistro de la Place. Bon appétit! Lodging: Le Vieux Logis

### **ROUFFIGNAC CAVE VISIT 1 Hour**

#### \*with shuttle

Fuel up with breakfast this morning before setting off into the undulating countryside. The route starts out with a mellow stretch along the Dordogne River Valley before taking you over the hills, past quiet farmland and tranquil hamlets, to Rouffignac Cave, renowned for its well-preserved prehistoric drawings.

We take a guided tour for an up-close look at these impressive depictions, which include rhinos, horses, mammoths, bison and other large game. It's an astounding visualization of how dynamic the landscape of Europe must have been eons ago.

After the visit, hop back on your bike and ride to our lunch spot at a family-run farm before continuing by bike or shuttling back to the hotel. If you decide to keep riding, stop for an afternoon coffee in the picturesque village of Limeuil along the banks of the winding Dordogne. You can then shuttle from here or opt to conquer a few last hills, where you'll be rewarded with spectacular views of the valley and verdant farmland below.

Later we convene for an elaborate meal created by

Michelin-starred chef Vincent Arnould, lauded as one of France's best culinary artists. *Lodging: Le Vieux Logis* 

### DAY 3

### CHÂTEAU DE MONBAZILLAC VISIT 1 Hour

Today we relish the gorgeous scenery hidden among the hills above the city of Bergerac. Trace the banks of the Dordogne River on one of the most scenic rides of the week. Fertile fields line the rolling route that leads you from one charming village to the next and through shady sections of national forest.

This area just east of Bordeaux boasts some of France's most luscious reds, rosés and whites. Spin past row upon row of maturing grapes, stopping in the quaint town of St-Nexans for a delicious meal.

After lunch, make your way to the spectacular 16th-century Château de Monbazillac. Situated in the midst of prestigious Monbazillac vineyards, the castle boasts a unique architectural blend of medieval fortifications and Renaissance exuberance. After soaking in the views of the Dordogne Valley, explore the château's multiple floors—don't miss the wine cave, where you can stop in for a tasting. Then end your ride with a climb to our hotel, Château des Vigiers, located outside of Monestier.

Settle into your elegant room and explore the grounds of this historic property. Dinner tonight is at the château's sophisticated Michelin-starred restaurant, Les Fresques. Lodging: Château des Vigiers



### DAY 4

### VIGNOBLES & CHÂTEAUX VISIT & TASTING 1 Hour

#### \*with shuttle

Ready to venture into the celebrated Bordeaux wine region? Jump in the saddle to roll along bucolic lanes and into hills that lead to a magnificent grapevine-laden landscape. Bike past some of the world's best-known vineyards and through seemingly undiscovered towns, replete with blooming gardens and friendly farmers. Then head to the delightful property of the amiable Mel family, where a gourmet lunch awaits you.

In the afternoon, shuttle or pedal to St-Émilion, a picturesque medieval town in the heart of the Bordeaux region. This area has a prestige all its own thanks to its outstanding Grand Cru wines, bustling streets, remarkable monuments and distinguished architecture; in fact, it's earned World Heritage status.

After retiring your bike for the day, make yourself comfortable at tonight's hotel, Hostellerie de Plaisance, which combines authentic charm with modern elegance and superb views of St-Émilion. Later we join an expert oenologist for a private tasting at Vignobles & Châteaux, St-Émilion's wine school. Then you're on your own for dinner in town—ask your leaders for their recommendations! Lodging: Hostellerie de Plaisance

### DAY 5

### **BIKING OPTIONS:**

Grand Estates Loop: 17 Miles (700' elevation gain)

St-Émilion Route: 38 Miles (1,600')

Romanesque Churches Route: 51 Miles (2.400')

### ST-ÉMILION WALKING TOUR 1 Hour

Spend today discovering enchanting villages and vineyards surrounding St-Émilion. Warm up your legs on a mostly flat section before starting a gradual climb to St-Georges and Montagne. Along the way feel free to take a breather and explore the Romanesque churches and quaint hilltop towns. Continue pedaling across rolling hills and farmland through the wine-producing communes of Lussac and Neac before stopping for lunch at a favorite winery.

The afternoon ride descends from St-Émilion, curving through the walled vineyards of Château Canon and passing Château Pavie. Leisurely bike through several of the valley's communities before a challenging climb leads you into the Côtes de Castillon. After cresting the hill you can look forward to a shaded picturesque stretch featuring many interesting sights, including churches, farms and reputable wineries.

If you're craving additional miles and want to tackle serious ascents, take the extra loop past small villages and 12th-century churches-you'll still make it back in time to relax before dinner. Otherwise, enjoy some downtime at the hotel or venture into St-Émilion, home to a multitude of wine shops worth visiting. For a tasty treat, be sure to sample the macarons of Madame Blanchez. A local specialty, the sweet and chewy cookies have been produced in St-Émilion since the 1600s.

This evening's walking tour highlights the 8th-century cave dwelling of St-Émilion, the catacombs and Église Monolithe, Europe's largest monolithic church, Later we celebrate our week with a festive dinner at the hotel's restaurant. Lodging: Hostellerie de Plaisance

### DAY 6

POMEROL GRAND CRU LOOP 12 Mi gain)

### **SHUTTLE TO BORDEAUX** 45 Minutes

If you'd prefer to sleep in this morning, hang back at the hotel and enjoy a leisurely breakfast. Otherwise, embark on a final spin to explore beautiful villages along St-Émilion's network of intertwining roads. Soak it all in, perhaps taking some last photos of châteaux ruins, old mills and vineyards.

After freshening up at the hotel, we gather for a farewell lunch. Afterward we shuttle to the Bordeaux train station, where our trip ends, and say our goodbyes. Please see "Arriving & Departing" for end-of-trip logistics.

### **ARRIVING & DEPARTING**

After reviewing the following information, please inform us of your arrival and departure plans on your *Personal Information Form*.

Depending on train schedules, you may need to spend the night before your trip in our meeting town or wait at the train station between your arrival and the start of your Backroads trip.

All prices are in US dollars and subject to change.

### **Meeting Time & Location**

On the first day of the trip, meet your Backroads Trip Leaders (the folks in Backroads T-shirts) at 11:15 a.m. outside the St-Jean train station in Bordeaux, France. Please arrive dressed in your biking clothes (or have them handy so you can change before the ride) and bring your luggage and a daypack with your rain gear and anything else you may want for today's ride (your luggage will be transported to our first night's accommodations).

### Conclusion of the Trip

On the last day of the trip, a private coach will drop you off at Bordeaux's St-Jean train station at approximately 1:30 p.m., in time to catch an afternoon train to Paris or other destinations.

### Flight Arrangements

This trip starts and ends in Bordeaux, France. We suggest flying into Paris and then taking a train to Bordeaux's St-Jean train station. Alternatively, you can fly directly to Bordeaux.

For information on Paris airports, visit www.adp.fr, the Aéroports de Paris website, which offers maps of the airports' terminals, up-to-date security advisories, and details on transportation options to and from Charles de Gaulle (also known as "Roissy;" airport code: CDG) and Orly (ORY) Airports.

**Flying into Bordeaux:** Alternatively, you can fly into the Bordeaux-Mérignac Airport (BOD;

www.bordeaux.aeroport.fr). Flight time from Paris to

Bordeaux is about 1 hour. The Bordeaux airport is serviced by most major airlines operating domestic flights within France, and departures are frequent.

For help arranging air transport to and from your Backroads trip, please work with your own travel advisor or you may choose to work with the Backroads Travel Desk at Dimensions in Travel. Their professional expert travel advisors are ready to share their insiders' knowledge of Backroads and our worldwide destinations and are available to assist you with any of your travel needs. Call 800-GO-ACTIVE (462-2848) to be connected with an advisor. Please note that consulting or ticketing fees may apply, depending on the services requested. The Backroads Travel Desk at Dimensions in Travel is open Monday-Friday, 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Pacific time.

### Train Travel Between Paris & Bordeaux

French Rail TGVs (*trains à grande vitesse* or high-speed trains) run regularly between central Paris' Montparnasse station and Bordeaux's St-Jean station. The trip takes 3½-4 hours and tickets start at about \$80.

Reservations are required on all TGV trains.

When returning to Paris from Bordeaux, it's possible to skip central Paris by taking the TGV from Bordeaux's St-Jean station directly to the Charles de Gaulle Airport. Travel time is around 4–4½ hours and tickets start at about \$100.

### <u>Transportation between Charles de</u> Gaulle Airport & Central Paris

**Taxi:** The fare to central Paris is \$60-\$80. Rates vary according to the time of day; supplements are added on Sundays and holidays, for each piece of luggage and for additional passengers. Although the airport is just 15 miles outside of central Paris, the trip into the city often takes close to an hour because of traffic.

Super Shuttle Paris (en.supershuttle.fr; +33-(0)8-11-70-78-12): This is a convenient and stress-free way to reach your Paris destination. Shared shuttle service costs around \$30 for one person and around \$20 for each additional passenger. Reservations are required. You can also reserve a private shuttle for up to eight passengers for approximately \$110.

Air France Bus (www.lescarsairfrance.com; +33-(0)8-92-35-08-20): Air France buses provide service from all terminals to several specific locations in central Paris,

including the Champs-Élysées, Gare Montparnasse and Gare de Lyon. Buses leave about every 30 minutes (depending on your destination) from early morning to late evening; one-way fares cost around \$20. Tickets can be purchased online, at the Air France Coach ticket office at the airport or from the driver.

Roissybus (www.ratp.fr; +33-(0)8-92-69-32-46): The Paris Transit Authority's (RATP) Roissybus offers service between the airport and Place de l'Opéra (at the corner of Rue Scribe and Rue Auber) every 15-20 minutes, 6 a.m.-12:30 a.m. Cost per person is approximately \$12. Travel time to central Paris varies from 45 minutes to well over 1 hour, depending on traffic. RATP also offers RER (or "RoissyRail") metro service between the airport's TGV stations and several Paris stations including Gare du Nord, Châtelet-Les Halles and Denfert-Rochereau. Trains run every 10-20 minutes 5 a.m.-midnight. The trip takes 25-45 minutes depending on your destination, and tickets cost about \$10 per person.

### <u>Transportation Between Orly Airport & Central Paris</u>

**Taxi:** Expect to pay \$45-\$70 for the trip into central Paris. Rates vary according to the time of day; supplements are added on Sundays and holidays, for each piece of luggage and for additional passengers. Orly is located about 9 miles south of the city center, a 20- to 40-minute ride, depending on traffic.

Super Shuttle Paris (en.supershuttle.fr; +33-(0)8-11-70-78-12): Super Shuttle also provides shared shuttle service from Orly Airport. The fare is about \$20 for one person and about \$10 for each additional passenger. Reservations are required.

Air France Bus (www.lescarsairfrance.com; +33-(0)8-92-35-08-20): The Air France bus runs between Orly, Gare Montparnasse, Invalides and Étoile/Champs-Élysées Metro stations every 30 minutes from around 6 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. The cost one-way is approximately \$14 per person; the trip time is 45 minutes to 1 hour.

Orlybus (www.ratp.fr; +33-(0)8-92-69-32-46): The Paris Transit Authority's (RATP) Orlybus provides service every 8-15 minutes, 6 a.m.-12:30 a.m. to Denfert-Rochereau Metro station for around \$9 per person; average trip time is 30 minutes. Another option is the Orlyval monorail, which departs for the Antony RER station from each terminal's arrivals area every 4-7

minutes, 6 a.m.-11 p.m.; the 6-minute trip costs about \$10. From here the RER B line will get you to Paris in about 25 minutes.

### Transportation Between Bordeaux Airport & St-Jean Train Station

The Bordeaux Airport Shuttle

(www.bordeaux.aeroport.fr) operates between the Bordeaux-Merignac Airport and the rail station every hour, 8 a.m.-11 p.m. The cost one-way is approximately \$9 per person; journey time is about 30 minutes.

### Meals

Food is an important part of the Backroads experience. For lunch we look for the best way to capture the essence of the region. ### DESTINATION DETAILS

### Climate

The Dordogne Valley and Bordeaux regions are pleasant during the months of May and June, with warm days and cooler evenings. Temperatures can get hot in July, August and September, with highs sometimes reaching the midto high-90s; October brings cooler weather. On most days you'll be comfortable biking in a short-sleeved jersey or T-shirt, although when you head out in the morning, you might want to wear a lightweight jacket or vest, arm warmers and knee or leg warmers. Rain is possible year-round; don't forget to bring waterproof breathable rain gear.
