Air-Conditioning

Parador de Baiona is a Premiere Hotel housed in a beautiful historic building that has a bio-friendly air-cooling system. This may not be as cold as the "true" air conditioning you are accustomed to. Fans are available upon request if guestrooms become warm during peak temperatures.



Day 1

Meeting Time: 10:30 a.m.

Meeting Location: The Santiago de Compostela train station (+34-(0)-902-320-320), located at Hórreo 75A in Santiago de Compostela, Spain

Additional Details: On the first day of the trip, meet your Backroads Trip Leaders (the folks in Backroads apparel). You will find your leaders in front of the main arched façade with the ADIF sign.

Attire & Luggage: Please arrive dressed in your biking clothes and bring your luggage and a daypack with your rain gear and anything else you may want for today's ride (your luggage will be transported to our first night's accommodations). If you choose to change into your gear following our shuttle, please be aware that a proper changing area is often unavailable.

Shuttle to A Guarda 1 Hour

Biking Options:

23 Miles (1,400' elevation gain)

¡Bienvenidos a Galicia! Situated right next to the Portuguese border, this unique province of Spain is an enchanting region of green landscapes, melodious local dialect and flavorful gastronomy.

Our trip begins in the city of Santiago de Compostela, home to the iconic Santiago de Compostela Cathedral, the final destination for thousands of pilgrims who hike the Camino de Santiago each year. Christians have walked these historic routes since the Middle Ages, and this week you'll get a taste of the same extraordinary journey. Not only does the Camino hold spiritual significance, but it also offers idyllic scenery and an incredible display of European artistic and architectural evolution.

From Santiago de Compostela, we drive to the fishing village of A Guarda to dine at a historic winery on some unbelievably fresh *mariscos* (seafood). Afterward, your Trip Leaders fit your bike and give a brief presentation on biking techniques and safety before we set off to trace our own Camino along the Galician pilgrimage route. Follow the coast, climbing up windswept cliffs to reach Monte de Santa Tecla, an area of intriguing circular *castros*— remains of an ancient fortified

settlement built by some of Galicia's Celtic Gallaeci tribes. Take time to explore the ruins and learn about the area's rich Celtic heritage that dates back over two millennia.

Continue biking to our historic hotel, Parador de Baiona. With privileged views over the town of Baiona and the sapphire ocean, this 15th century *parador* earned a spot in history as the first observation point of Columbus' ship, *La Pinta*, as it approached Spanish soil with news of the New World. Take a scenic walk atop the surrounding medieval fortress walls or head down to the white-sand beach below to dip your toes in the Atlantic.

Settle into your room before we gather tonight for a welcome toast and an exquisite first dinner together within the medieval walls. *Lodging: Parador de Baiona*

Day 2

Biking Options:

28 Miles (2,000' elevation gain)

33 Miles (2,300')

46 Miles (3,000')

53 Miles (4,800')

Fuel up with breakfast at the hotel before setting out into the Rías Baixas, a white wine-producing region known for its crisp aromatic Albariño wines. Yesterday's coastal greenery is replaced by rows of tidy vineyards as we journey inland, the sea still visible from each hilltop view. Passing lush greenery and ancient towns, our route reaches the Minho River, the natural border between Spain and Portugal, where we pause for a lunch of traditional Galician cuisine.

Afterward, follow the Camiño da Costa (coastal Camino) to the historic town of Tui, famous for its well-preserved medieval old town and for being an important point of crossing for the Camino Portugués. Stop here for a coffee if you'd like, then ascend into the pine forests of Monte Aloia Nature Park to reach gorgeous sweeping views of the Atlantic Ocean. Descend back into Baiona to enjoy a little bit of R&R at our *parador* and perhaps a dip in the sea.

It's a short stroll into the lovely center of Baiona for dinner on your own this evening. Perhaps you'll be tempted to try the *zamburiñas* (scallops) or the *merluza a la gallega* (hake with paprika and potatoes).

Or, for those who prefer turf to surf, Galicia is also famous for its divine *chuletón de buey* (beef steak). ¡Buen provecho! *Lodging: Parador de Baiona*



Day 3

Shuttle to Ribeira Sacra 2 Hours

Biking Options:

18 Miles (1,900' elevation gain)

29 Miles (3,300')

37 Miles (3,700')

43 Miles (4,800')

After a hearty breakfast, set your sights eastward for a ride into the heart of Galicia. From our hotel, we shuttle to the Ribeira Sacra wine country, taking in breathtaking views of terraced vineyards clinging to rocky mountainsides. Our roller-coaster-like route winds through the Cañón do Sil, one of the Ribeira Sacra's most famous attractions, tracing the Sil River through deep gorges with fjordlike slopes that rise nearly 500 meters above the water. This striking landscape offers plenty of climbs and descents, with a midway stop to refuel at a bodega perched among what feel like vineyards in the sky.

Following lunch, bike to the winemaking village of Sober, nestled between idyllic woodlands and the peaceful shores of the Sil River. Here, you'll find our boutique hotel, Áurea Palacio de Sober, a grand stone manor with architectural elements that harken back to medieval Galicia. Unwind, stroll through the hotel's landscaped gardens and elegant central courtyard, or lounge by the indoor or outdoor pool before we gather for a gourmet dinner. *Lodging: Áurea Palacio de Sober*

Day 4

Shuttle to Xinzo de Limia 1 Hour

Biking Options:

20 Miles (1,700' elevation gain)

27 Miles (3,300')

54 Miles (5,200')

This morning we say farewell to Galicia and hop across the border to the rural Portuguese region of Trás-os-Montes, which means "beyond the mountains." Here, in the remote Barroso Mountains, most people live off the grid, nourished by the crops and meat they produce, the water that flows from their village fountains and the bread baked in the village mill. An ancient system of collective land stewardship, the *baldios* system, is still in effect here, and it has protected local ecosystems and kept farming sustainable.

Enjoy your fill of the sights, sounds and smells of this quiet region on two wheels. Take a coffee break just before crossing the border into Montalegre, a medieval village with whitewashed buildings clustered around an impressive medieval castle. Then, spin onward to a country restaurant where we're treated to a lunch packed with local ingredients.

Our afternoon ride leads to the town of Vidago, and the aptly named Vidago Palace Hotel. This jaw-dropping property is a Baroque dreamscape of frescoes, columns, wrought-iron skylights and grand windows, surrounded by a manicured park that invites you in for an afternoon stroll among magnolia, lavender and pine. Dine at your leisure tonight in the hotel's casual wine cellar, where tapas are served family-style in a charming café-like space. *Lodging: Vidago Palace Hotel*



Day 5

Biking Options:

16 Miles (1,300' elevation gain)

26 Miles (2,300')

40 Miles (3,300')

49 Miles (4,600')

This morning we embark on a beautiful loop ride through pine forests, finally descending into the town of Chaves, where you can enjoy lunch on your own. One of the earliest settlements in the region, Chaves has a fascinating history dating back to Roman times, when settlers were drawn to its fertile plains and thermal springs. Wander around the town's cobblestone streets and admire its medieval castle and arched Roman bridge, stretching over the Tâmega River.

After lunch, complete the loop ride back to our hotel, admiring views of northern Portugal's picturesque vineyards and rolling hills along the way. If you're interested in a challenge, you can also climb up to the town of Bobadela, a quiet hamlet just outside Chaves.

There's plenty of time this afternoon to enjoy the hotel's amenities. You may want to sit by the pool, soak in the spa's thermal waters or perfect your swing on the golf course. (Spa treatments and golf are not included in the total trip price).

Tonight we toast to a wonderful two-country journey before sitting down to a farewell dinner in the hotel's grand ballroom. *Lodging: Vidago Palace Hotel*

Day 6

Morning Loop 16 Miles (1,500' elevation gain)

Shuttle to Porto 1½ Hours

After a week of riding through the magnificent landscape of Galicia and northern Portugal, complete your journey with a morning loop through the peaceful forest surrounding our hotel, biking beneath oaks and stately cypresses. If you'd prefer a more leisurely morning, relax at the hotel, walk through the gardens or enjoy a morning spa treatment. Back at the hotel, freshen up before bidding your Backroads Trip Leaders farewell and boarding the shuttle to Porto.

Flight Arrangements

This trip starts in Santiago de Compostela, Spain and ends in Porto, Portugal. We suggest flying into Santiago de Compostela Lavacolla Airport (airport code: SCQ) and out of Porto Airport, also known as Francisco de Sá Carneiro Airport (OPO).

You may also consider booking your round-trip transatlantic flight through a larger hub, like Lisbon's Portela Airport (LIS) or Madrid's Adolfo Suárez-Barajas Airport (MAD), and connecting to our meet location in Santiago and our drop-off location in Porto by domestic flight and/or train.

For help arranging air transportation to and from your

Backroads trip, please work with your own travel advisor, or you may work with our preferred travel agency. Their professional expert travel advisors are ready to assist you with any of your travel needs. Please note that they are an independent travel agency and consulting and ticketing fees may apply, based on the services requested. Simply ask your Backroads Trip Consultant to connect you! You can also book directly with the airline or through a travel website.

When to Book Flights

Please note that trip start and end locations are subject to change and can vary by departure. A Travel Planner, complete with trip details specific to your chosen date, will be sent to you at time of booking or soon after and will be viewable in your Backroads account. **Do not schedule your flights until your reservation is confirmed.**

Transportation between Santiago de Compostela and the Airport

Taxi: From the airport to most locations in Santiago de Compostela, a flat daytime fare of approximately \$23 is charged for the 20-minute ride. A supplement of about 50 cents for each piece of luggage and \$3.50 for booking the service usually applies. None of these supplements may be charged when nighttime rates are applied.

Bus: Public buses run frequently between the city center and airport for a fare of around \$3.30. Visit www.empresafreire.com for more information.

Transportation between Porto Airport and Central Porto

Porto's airport is a 20- to 30-minute trip from the city center, depending on traffic.

Taxi: A ride to the airport costs around \$20–\$30, plus an additional charge if you have excess baggage (about \$2 per bag). There's a 20 percent surcharge added on weekends, holidays, and between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Be sure the meter is running.

Metro: Lightrail Line E/Violeta serves the airport, and trains run 6 a.m.–1:30 a.m. The fare is approximately \$1.70. Visit www.metrodoporto.pt for more information.

Bus: Public buses run frequently to the airport for approximately \$1.65. Visit www.stcp.pt for more information.

Buying Train Tickets

There are several ways you can buy rail tickets:

Travel advisor: If you need assistance booking your rail tickets, please contact your travel advisor or our preferred travel agency by calling 800-462-2848.

Train stations: You can buy rail tickets from any train station in Spain or Portugal. In the larger stations, the reservation counters are usually located outside of the main departure area. Many stations are equipped with automatic ticket machines, from which you can purchase tickets and reservation coupons for in-country travel and for popular international routes. The machines accept cash and credit or debit cards with your PIN.

Online from state rail services: For direct online ticket purchasing and to check the most up-to-date train schedules, visit the Web site of Spain's Red Nacional de Ferrocarriles Españoles, or Renfe (www.renfe.com) or Portugal's Comboios de Portugal, or CP (www.cp.pt/passageiros/en).

Rail Europe: You can also purchase tickets and make reservations through Rail Europe (www.raileurope.com; 800-622-8600). Be aware that they charge service fees.

Climate

However, this region is prone to variable weather, including heat and year-round rain that can strike at any time of the day, particularly in the fall from October onward. **To stay comfortable during your adventures, be sure to pack waterproof breathable rain gear and a sweater or light jacket.**

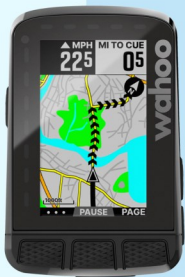
