HOUSING DISCRIMINATION & YOUR RIGHT TO FAIR HOUSING

What is housing discrimination?

The Fair Housing Act protects people from discrimination when they are renting or buying a home, getting a mortgage, seeking housing, or engaging in other housing related activities

What protects you from housing discrimination?

Article 4 of the Baltimore City Code prohibits housing discrimination against individuals based on the following:

race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, marital status, age, ancestry, & source of income

The Fair Housing Act of 1968, as amended

prohibits housing discrimination against individuals based on the following:

race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, & disability

Article 20 of the Annotated Code of Maryland

prohibits housing discrimination against individuals based on the following:

race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, marital status, & source of income

HOUSING DISCRIMINATION & YOUR RIGHT TO FAIR HOUSING

What are some examples of housing discrimination?

Refusing to rent to a potential tenant because of their race

Steering a potential homebuyer to a different neighborhood because of the homebuyers national origin

Setting different terms or conditions on a mortgage loan because the applicant is pregnant

Refusing to provide a reasonable accommodation to a person with a disability, such as allowing them to have a reserved parking space despite there being a no reserved parking policy

Refusing to provide homeowner's insurance because of a person's disability

Segregating tenants based on their religion

How long do I have to file a complaint of housing discrimination?

To file with the CRC the alleged discrimination must have taken place in the past 180 days

To file with HUD or the Maryland Commission on Civil Rights, the alleged discrimination must have taken place in the past year.

To file a private lawsuit, the alleged discrimination must have taken place in the past two years.

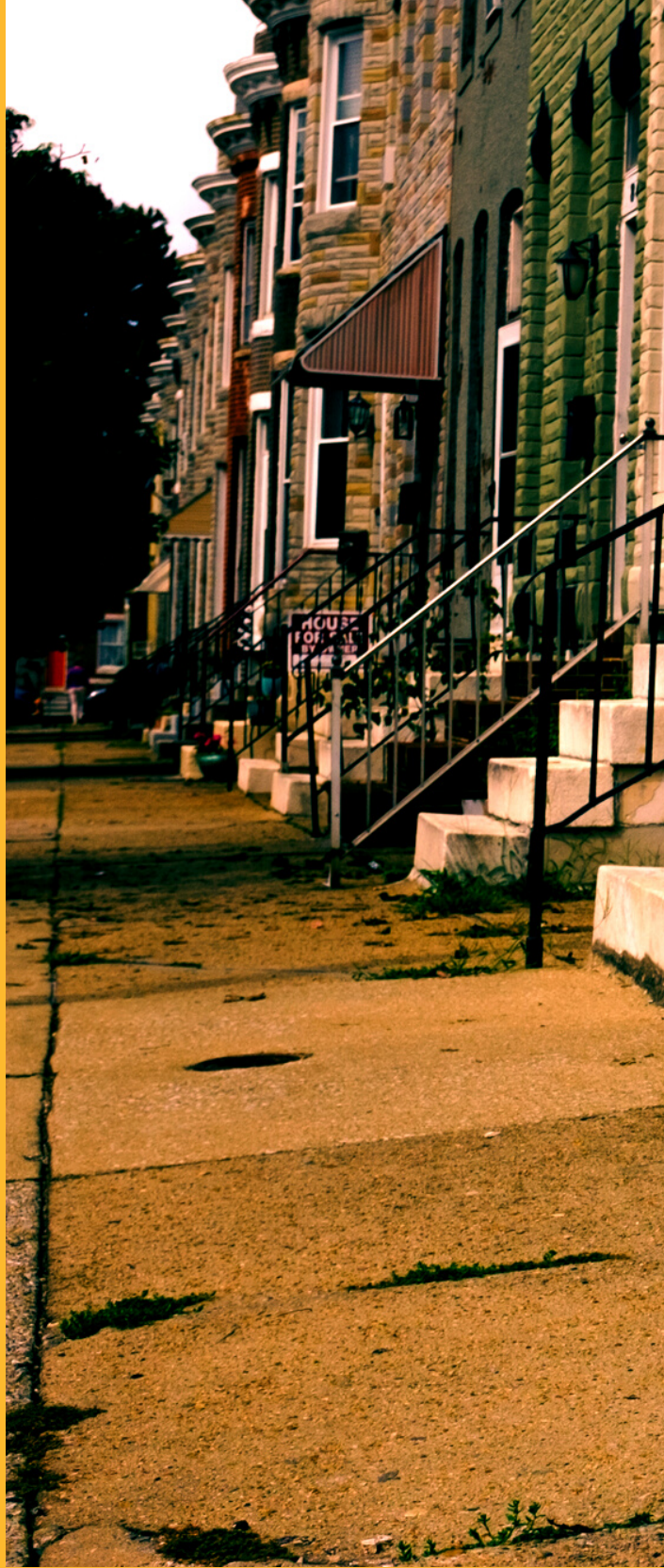
