

WHAT CAN LANDLORDS DO TO ASSURE FAIR HOUSING?

1. Avoid discriminatory advertising, do not express a preference or limitation for or against a specific class of persons
2. Establish written policies and procedures and apply them equally to all persons requesting information or application forms
3. Do not make comments, derogatory remarks, or harass a resident based on their protected class characteristics
4. Allow residents with disabilities to make reasonable modifications
5. Make reasonable accommodations in policies and procedures for residents with disabilities

WHAT TRAINING DOES THE CRC PROVIDE TO HOUSING PROFESSIONALS?

1. Fair Housing 101- This training workshop provides a review of federal and local fair housing anti-discrimination laws. The workshop provides relevant data and examples to illustrate course content.
2. Source of Income - This training workshop focuses on the newly-enacted Ordinance #19-234, which added "source of income" as a protected group in housing discrimination.

FEDERAL AND LOCAL LAW

FEDERAL: THE FAIR HOUSING ACT, AS AMENDED

Prohibits housing discrimination against the individuals based on the following:

race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, & disability

ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND

Prohibits housing discrimination against all federal protected classes in addition to:

sexual orientation, gender identity, & marital status

ARTICLE 4 OF THE BALTIMORE CITY CODE

Prohibits housing discrimination against all federal protected classes & state protected classes in addition to:

age, ancestry, & source of income
