**Board Nominations:** Any interested candidate can self-nominate or be nominated by another person. You do not have to have an account in Member 365 to nominate a candidate, though you must have an account to run for a seat and/or to vote in the election. To be a member of the CoC, you must be registered in Member 365. Support was provided during the meeting to help with Member 365 sign ups. Individuals and agencies each have one vote. Flyers were also provided with a QR code to help CoC members access the nomination form and Member 365.

### **Agenda Item III: Logo Vote and Survey Update**

**CoC Logo:** Three potential logos were proposed at the last meeting. A survey was provided to identify which logo the membership preferred. The logo selected was shared. The next step in the approval process is to present the recommended logo to the CoC Board for vote in the next meeting, scheduled on October 17, 2024.

**CoC Calendar for CY 2025:** The CoC Chairs collaborated with MOHS to develop an annual calendar of meetings for the next calendar year. Eddie shared the draft calendar. Once it is finalized, it will be sent out to all members and posted in Member 365 and on the MOHS website. Invitations for meetings will also be sent out to members.

### **Agenda Item IV: MOHS Updates- Ernestina Simmons, MOHS Executive Director**

**CoC NOFA:** Final CoC rankings will be published today, October 10, 2024.

**Relationship between MOHS and the CoC:** Director Simmons encouraged the CoC to keep investing in Baltimore City and to ensure that people know that MOHS and the CoC care about them. She stated she feels very grateful to be a part of the CoC and the goal is to always improve our system. The relationship between MOHS and the CoC is critical to be able to end homelessness in Baltimore City.

### **Agenda Items V: Celebration for World Homeless Day Speech and Acknowledgements**

**Testimonials:** Two very powerful testimonials were given by Iya Dammons and Da'Mel Ross. Both presentations highlighted the need for significant improvement in how and who are providing the services and resources to help people exit homelessness. The CoC and MOHS must ensure that services and programs provided to individuals and families experiencing homelessness be racially and culturally sensitive and that people providing the services must reflect those that are seeking help.

**Acknowledgements:** CoC members were asked to share acknowledgements with the group.

### **Agenda Items VI: Committee and Community Updates**

**Project Wave:** provides free internet service.

**Layla's Love:** provides sustainable housing. There will be an event, "Spread the Love Initiative".

**Safe Haven:** has been renamed to be Maryland Safe Haven. They have a new facility with 14 units of housing, office space, and a community center. There will be an Open House soon. It was announced that there is a significant grant opportunity and anyone who is interested in being involved should contact Iya Dammons.

**PIT Count:** the planning process for the PIT count is underway. Ellis Lee is the lead for the CoC. There is a great need for CoC volunteers, including those from the Provider community. There will be food available, including a vegan option.

**YES:** is looking for a new Executive Director. They also have a new site for their program.

**CoC Update:** the CoC will be putting out a survey of its membership to identify the needs of the community.
