2024 Point-in-Time Count Results

The Point-in-Time (PIT) Count is a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) mandated assessment that provides a snapshot of homelessness in a community on a single night (NOTE: In 2023, 113 persons were counted as experiencing unsheltered homelessness. The City of Baltimore did not conduct an unsheltered count for the year 2024).

1,487 People counted as experiencing homelessness in Baltimore City on a single night in January 2024.

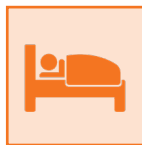

59% of people resided in **Emergency Shelter**

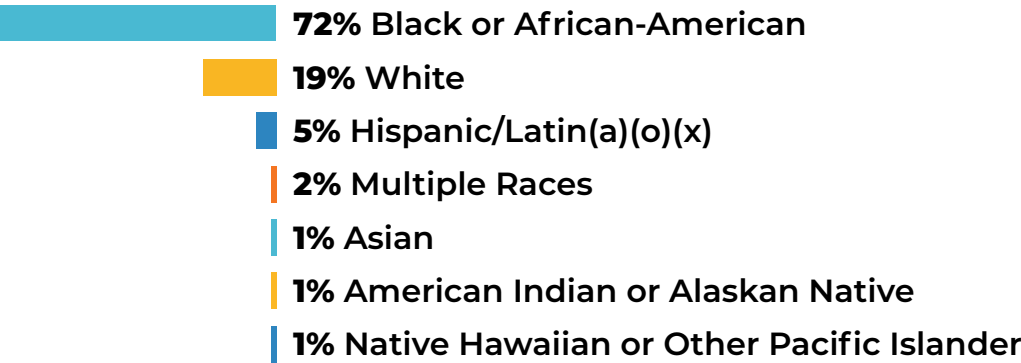
Emergency Shelter provides people experiencing an episode of homelessness with safe, low-barrier, and temporary refuge.



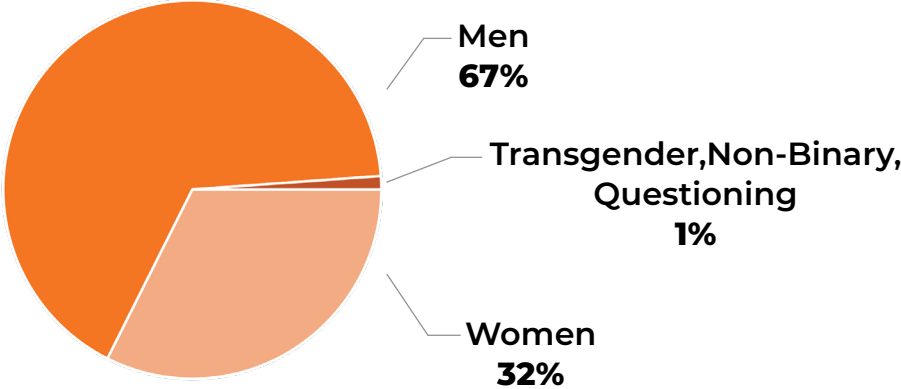
41% of people resided in **Transitional Housing**

Transitional Housing provides people experiencing homelessness with shelter and supportive services for up to two years.

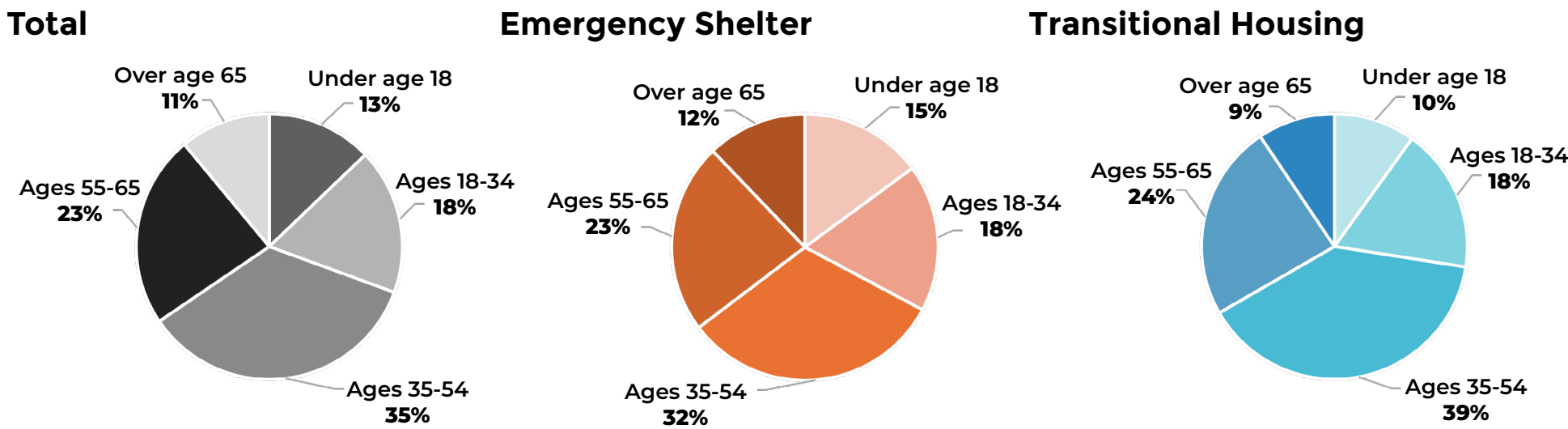
