This letter serves as the Department of Transportation's (DOT) official response to the above-mentioned case. The Department has investigated the allegations in your letter dated July 29, 2025, and has concluded that the employee [REDACTED] was in violation of the City's September 9, 2020, Executive Order #83110 regarding the Arrest Policy. While [REDACTED] did receive communication regarding [REDACTED] arrest, [REDACTED] did not report the information to upper management nor to DOT Human Resources as per the Executive Order #83110. As a result of this violation [REDACTED] was disciplined.

Additionally, the Department will be providing agency-wide training on the arrest policy to include the distribution as well as acknowledgment receipts from each employee.
