# Water Main Breaks

## Understanding Water Main Breaks

Not every puddle or flowing water in the street means there's a water main break. Sometimes, what you see may come from a leaking service line, a running hydrant, or even stormwater runoff. A true water main break happens when an underground pipe cracks or bursts—often from aging infrastructure, temperature shifts, or pressure changes. When that occurs, DPW crews respond quickly to locate the break, shut off the water, and dig to repair the damaged pipe. These repairs can take time, especially during cold or extreme weather. Staying informed and giving crews space to work helps us restore service safely and as quickly as possible for everyone.





If you notice unusual water flow or suspect a break, report it to 311 so our crews can investigate and respond promptly.

## Stay Cool and Plan Ahead

DPW continues to lead the City of Baltimore in its heat response efforts, ensuring that both our residents and workforce remain safe during periods of extreme summer heat. Keeping our crews safe is a community effort. To prevent heat-related injuries, DPW begins collections at 5 a.m., allowing crews to complete routes before the hottest part of the day. Residents are reminded to set out trash and recycling the night before the scheduled pickup.

Our updated heat operations are designed to protect workers, while keeping Baltimore's neighborhoods clean. We encourage everyone to stay informed by following our **#HeatAlertsBmore** on social media for real-time service updates and safety reminders.
