Office of Equity and Civil Rights received nine (9) complaint intakes on behalf of the Police Accountability Board in January. Eight (8) complaints were filed against Baltimore Police Department. One (1) complaint was filed against Johns Hopkins Police Department.

The Administrative Charging Committee heard eighty-five (85) cases in January.

There were seven (7) scheduled trial boards. Seven (7) trial boards were held. All cases resulted in sustained findings. Disciplinary outcomes included three (3) instances of loss of leave, two (2) instances of formal written counseling, and one (1) letter of reprimand. One additional case heard on January 22, 2026, has reached an outcome, which has not yet been reported to this office.
