

## C. C. SCHUYLER RITES NOT SET

### Funeral Arrangements for Fargo Pioneer Await Arrival of Daughter

Arrangements for funeral services for Clarence C. Schuyler, 70, are awaiting the arrival Sunday of a daughter, Mrs. Walter Thorp, Britton, S. D., from Long Beach, Calif., where she has been spending some time.

Mr. Schuyler died Wednesday afternoon at his home, 810 Broadway, after about four weeks illness from angina pectoris. He was one of Fargo's earliest and best known pioneer businessmen. Prior to his illness he conducted a real estate and insurance business.

Mr. Schuyler was born in Syracuse, N. Y., Dec. 18, 1855. He came to Fargo in 1878, and a year later definitely established his residence here. He has lived here continuously since then.

He was connected with the Citizens National bank as an officer of that institution for several years after his arrival. This bank later became the First National bank. For about 12 years Mr. Schuyler was in charge of the United States land office here.

Theresa Byrne of Minneapolis became Mr. Schuyler's wife in 1880.

The pioneer businessman was a member of Shloh lodge No. 1, A. F. & A. M., the Scottish Rite bodies, El Zagal temple and the Elks lodge.

Surviving besides Mrs. Thorp are his widow, and two daughters, Mrs. Raymond Lawrence, 610 Fourteenth st S; Mrs. U. M. Henchan, Seattle, Wash.; and a son, Philip Schuyler, Britton, S. D. The latter arrived this morning. Mrs. Henchan is expected Friday.

The Schuyler residence, once on the outskirts of Fargo, but now close to the business section of Fargo's busiest street, has long been a landmark, because of the spacious and well-parked grounds, surrounding it, so near to the heart of Fargo. This residence was erected 45 years ago and has been occupied continuously by the Schuyler family for 41 years.
