

# **Educator Preparation Laboratory**

Significant changes in classroom teaching and school design are necessary to prepare students for a globalized 21st century, where skills like critical thinking, collaboration, and the ability to apply knowledge across a range of contexts are crucial to students' individual success and the health of our society. Teacher and principal preparation programs play a key role in developing educators who can create student-centered environments that promote deeper learning.

Bank Street Graduate School of Education partnered with the Learning Policy Institute, a national organization focused on conducting and disseminating research to improve education policy and practice, to launch Educator Preparation Laboratory (EdPrepLab) in 2019. By bringing together some of the nation's strongest teacher and principal preparation programs as founding partners, EdPrepLab advances deeper learning and equity at the nexus of policy, practice, and research. EdPrepLab leads the field by advocating for exemplary educator preparation practice, conducting and disseminating research on those practices, and calling for policies that enable educators and educator preparation programs to do their best work.

# **Our Approach**

EdPrepLab is a community founded by leading preparation programs dedicated to deepening educator practice by sharing their work with other network member institutions, with the wider field, and with policymakers across the country. Designed to bring practice, research, and policy in closer alignment, our approach focuses on three key elements:

- Creating a network of preparation programs that meets regularly—both in-person and through virtual meetings—to work toward strengthening coursework and clinical practice by integrating the latest research on Social, Emotional, and Academic Development and the Science of Learning and Development.
- Conducting original design-based research and outreach about the network's preparation models, which
  will build a deeper knowledge base for the field and engage a larger circle of programs in learning about and
  innovating toward bringing exemplary practices to scale.
- Engaging policymakers and policy influencers at the local, state, and national level to shape licensing, accreditation, and related policies that can help transform the field of educator preparation and advance the spread of deeper learning practices across teacher and leader preparation programs.
