Demand was \$280 mostly good to very good early week and still remained good later in the week even \$260 though futures took a tumble. The CME Cattle Complex took a sharp downturn mid-\$240 week after a sharp upturn on Monday. This pullback comes after weeks of strong gains \$220 fueled by tight supply and very good demand. It seems that fundamentals are ruling the \$200 day in the fed cattle sector as the nearby Live cattle contract was 18.00 under the cash. \$180 Something will have to give in the coming few weeks. The correction this week did \$160 seem harsh to the downside, however the weekly trend on the Live Cattle contracts were from 2.450 to 2.975 lower. The Feeder Cattle contracts were mostly 2.750 to 2024 ---- 5 YR AVG 3.100 lower. The market watcher felt like they had been whipsawed this week from one extreme to the other. Cattle producers are feeling very optimistic about the market for the remainder of the year and want to make sure they have cattle in their pens.
