Tod Williams and Billie Tsien formed a partnership in 1986 and established their studio on Central Park South where they still work today. The twenty-eight person office primarily works for institutions that value issues of aspiration and meaning, timelessness and beauty, designing buildings that are exquisitely made, enduring, and useful in ways that speak to both efficiency and the spirit. Matter, light, texture, detail, and most of all experience are the essence of Williams and Tsien's architecture.

Projects opening in 2012 include the Asia Society Center in Hong Kong, the Barnes Foundation in Philadelphia, the First Congregational Church of Christ in Washington DC, a performing and visual arts center at the University of Chicago, and a dormitory at Haverford College. Also under construction is an information technology campus for Tata Consultancy Services in Mumbai, India, two new skating rinks for Brooklyn's Prospect Park, the Andlinger Center for Energy and the Environment at Princeton University, and an addition to Savidge Library at the MacDowell Colony.
