

BARNES from Home: Family Art Time

Paper Bead Necklace

Ages 8-12

This Zuni Pueblo necklace is made with natural materials like coral, shell, and turquoise. The unknown artist turned these materials into beads, which were then strung onto a necklace. Learn how to make beads out of paper and create your own powerful jewelry.

Materials:

Old magazines or newspapers, scissors, glue, toothpick or skewer, string, large sewing needle, paint and brush (optional)

Instructions:

Step 1: Cut several long triangles (about six inches tall and one-inch wide) from pages of magazines or newspapers. Each triangle will make one bead, so you'll need about 30 triangles for a full necklace.

Step 2: Starting with the widest end, wrap the paper triangle around a toothpick. When you reach the end, place a small drop of glue on the triangle point to seal the bead.

Step 3: Hold for 30 seconds to dry. Remove toothpick to reuse, and set bead aside.

Step 4: Repeat until you have at least 30 beads. If you made newspaper beads, you can paint them to add color.

Step 5: Use the sewing needle to thread your beads with string. Leave enough string on each end to tie the necklace together. Take a photo and share with us using #BarnesatHome.
