Governor's Challenge Basketball Tournament Brings Excitement to Salisbury

Delaware Captures Third Straight Championship, Fans Enjoy the Show

(Salisbury, MD) For years, the Wicomico Youth & Civic Center has brought high school boys basketball players together to compete on the hardwood over the holiday break. However, in 2010, a unique spin was put on the event as Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley issued a challenge to Delaware Governor Jack Markell. The wager: a Maryland Smith Island Cake to a Delaware Peach Pie. The inaugural Governor's Challenge Basketball Tournament was born bringing with it a new level of excitement to this holiday basketball classic. In 2012, the 3rd Governor's Challenge continued to bring that excitement to the Wicomico Youth & Civic Center as 37 teams competed from 4 different states. The competition was divided into two different tournament cups; the Governor's Challenge (MD vs. DE teams) and the Regional Dr. Pepper 10 Cup which included teams from Maryland, Virginia and Pennsylvania. The Governor's Challenge was the closest it has ever been as both Maryland and Delaware schools had secured 10 wins apiece heading into the very last game of the tournament, a classic showdown between Milford, DE and Parkside High from Maryland. In a back and forth affair, Milford pulled out an exciting win, 63-57, to give Delaware the trophy for the third straight year and secure another Smith Island Cake for Governor Markell.

This year's event also featured some new and popular attractions including the Dr. Pepper 3 – Point Shootout and the Dr. Pepper Slam Dunk Contest. A total of 8 players were selected for the 3 – Point Shootout to try and be crowned the top shooter in the tournament. Kevin Heine of Oakdale High School in Ijamsville, MD was the winner, shooting his way to a 1 point victory in the final round. In the Slam Dunk Contest, Kory Holden of JM Bennett High School in Salisbury, MD was declared the winner by the judges after putting on a spectacular show and making the crowd come alive. He beat out three other contestants with an array of exciting dunks securing the trophy and bragging rights. Fans also enjoyed interactive games in the lobby, great door prizes, fan contests, and a great week of basketball! It was the place to be for basketball fans from all over Delmarva and beyond!
