How do I become a member of the parish?

Membership in the Orthodox Church begins at baptism (Chrismation for some) and continues throughout our life. An important part of that membership is a commitment to support the church financially with tithes and offerings side by side with your brothers and sisters. In doing this, we are true members of the Body of Christ involved in living according to His word and within the Church. *("The whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love." Eph 4:16)*


...our active commitment to use all our time, talent and treasure for the benefit of humankind in grateful acknowledgment of Christ's redeeming love.

...devotion and service to God and His Church as persons, as families, as Diocese, as Archdiocese and as Church universal.




