Burk's Falls and District Historical Society Archives – A Guide to the Holdings

In addition to the many artifacts that may be seen on display in the Wiseman's Corner Schoolhouse and the Watt Farm House, the Historical Society is fortunate to hold several interesting collections of historical photographs, newspapers, business correspondence, printed letterhead, family histories, manuscripts, journals and other ephemera. Visitors are invited to enquire about topics of interest and one of the staff or volunteers would be pleased to see if we are able to find items for your review while at the museum. A brief summary of our collection is provided below:

PHOTOGRAPHS: Thanks in large part to the generosity of the late Ted Bunt, our archive contains several hundred old photographs and post cards, many over 100 years old. The collection includes images of Burk's Falls from its earliest years, including prior to and immediately after the disastrous fire of June 1908. Many early buildings and industries are well represented, as are the Magnetawan River steamboats from the 1890's to the 1930's.

NEWSPAPERS: Older copies of the Burk's Falls Arrow are quite scarce, and we are fortunate to have a few, including one from 1887, and one from 1908 documenting the Great Fire. We have several issues from the 1920's and 1930's and many more from 1940's onward. We also recently acquired a large collection of the Arrow from 1947-66, the Powassan News from 1917 to 1966 and the successor newspaper, the Almaguin News from 1967 into the 2010's. A project is underway to properly catalogue and index these newspapers.

SCHOOL HISTORIES: Before school consolidation took place in the 1960's, each Township had several one room schoolhouses (of which our Wiseman's Corner Heritage Centre is one - S.S. #4 Ryerson). We have several written descriptions and reminiscences of the many schools in the area, as well as photographs of some. We are actively seeking copies of school yearbooks from more recent years.

FAMILY HISTORIES: At present, we have only a few histories of local families; we would welcome copies of any additional family histories that may be available. We do have a history file of the "First Family" of Burk's Falls, David Francis "Frank" Burk, available for viewing.

MANUSCRIPTS & JOURNALS: We have several journals and transcriptions of oral histories from early residents of Burk's Falls and District in which they describe their memories of life in the early days. A project is underway to make transcriptions and index each of these manuscripts.

LEGAL DOCUMENTS: We have a small collection of legal documents, mostly land deeds, mortgages, and similar items from the 19th and early 20th century. It includes an original land patent from Armour Township in the 1880's.

PETTITT FARM COLLECTION: Our collection of business receipts from the Pettitt Farm (Lot 11 Con. 6 Proudfoot Township) is a remarkable record of local commerce from about 1890 to 1940. Now housed in an archival binder, it consists of the following items: Vol 1. Receipts from Burk's Falls businesses, including among many others, James Sharpe, Fowler Bros. and A. A. Agar's General Stores, Magnetawan Tannery, Knight Bros. Planing Mill, doctors, dentists and other merchants in the village; Vol 2. Similar business receipts from merchants in Kearney and the Sand Lake area; Vol 3. Regional and national businesses such as Massey Harris, Cockshutt Plough Co. and others; Vol 4. A handwritten journal about the Pettitt family and their building of the log house on the property, together with additional information about the family.

T.B. (Boyd) HIGGINSON COLLECTION:

Boyd Higginson lived in Burk's Falls from about 1965 to 1976. He was employed as Principal of the Burk's Falls High School, and later at the East Parry Sound Board of Education. While living in Burk's Falls he started a private publishing venture, Old Rectory Press, (named after his residence

in the old Anglican rectory on Queen St.) to publish the family and local history pamphlets he wrote as a lifelong hobby. Three of these pamphlets are of direct relevance to the history of the Burk's Falls area: *Sportsman's Paradise* Volumes I (1965) and II (1972); and *Bengough and Burk's Falls* (1975).

In 2015, we were able to acquire a modest collection of Higginson's pamphlets, correspondence, typescripts and other items of his Canadiana collecting interest, written by and to Higginson. A pamphlet is available which records a brief biography and bibliography of the work of this interesting Burk's Falls resident.

MILITARY RECORDS:

The museum archives an assortment of military records from local sources, including selected records of the local men and boy who joined the 162nd (Parry Sound) Battalion during the Great War.

SCHOOL BOOKS

At the Wiseman's Corner School House, we have a collection of early Ontario school textbooks, prescribed for use during the 1880's to 1930's.
