READING: You will be required to read *How to Steal a Dog* by Barbara O'Connor. This book can be found at your public library, or can be ordered online. As you read the book, you will also need to answer the questions attached below.

Please print out the questions <u>before</u> reading. Read the book with an adult, taking turns reading and stopping to discuss along the way. When you finish reading daily, look over the questions and try to answer some as you go. Answers should be handwritten on the worksheet provided. If additional space is needed, you may write on a lined piece of paper and attach to the packet. Since you will be REQUIRED to take the AR test for this story the first FULL week of school in August, reading it near the end of summer may be best, so you don't forget all the important details. Please be prepared to turn in the completed questions on the second day of school in August! We'll discuss the novel, sharing connections and insights.

I. Read page I of the story. What do we already know about Georgina from just
one page of text?
2. Where are Georgina and her mother and brother living at the beginning of the
story? Why are they living there?

3. Define <i>homelessnes</i> s. Is Georgina's homelessness similar or different to what
you thought homelessness was? How is it similar/different?
4. How does Georgina come up with the idea of stealing a dog? What is her
olan?
5. Georgina knows that stealing a dog is wrong, but does it anyway. Have you
ever done something that you knew was wrong because you felt like you had
no other choice? How did you feel after doing it?
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6. Why does Georgina think Carmella is going to be rich?
7. Compare Georgina's life with her friend Luanne's. What are some differences
in how the girls live?
8. Luanne notices some changes in Georgina's appearance and personality. If
you were Luanne and knew there was something wrong with your friend, what do
you think you would do?

9. Mookie shares two mottos with Georgina. Choose one of them and explain what
you think it means. Use an example from the story.
10. Compare and contrast Mookie's homelessness to Georgina's. How is it the
same or different?
II. There are two times that Mama uses her "mean voice" with Georgina. Why do
you think she does this? Do you think Mama is really a mean person?
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12. Think of the problems that could come up from stealing a dog. How does
Georgina think about these problems in her list of rules? Does she address the
problems, and how?
13. Find one time when Georgina gets frustrated with Toby. Why do you think
she is impatient with him?
14. Re-read the last 4 pages of the book. Do you think it has a happy ending?
Explain why or why not.

15. If you could interview one person from the story, who would you interview?	
Write down 3 questions that you would ask in your interview.
