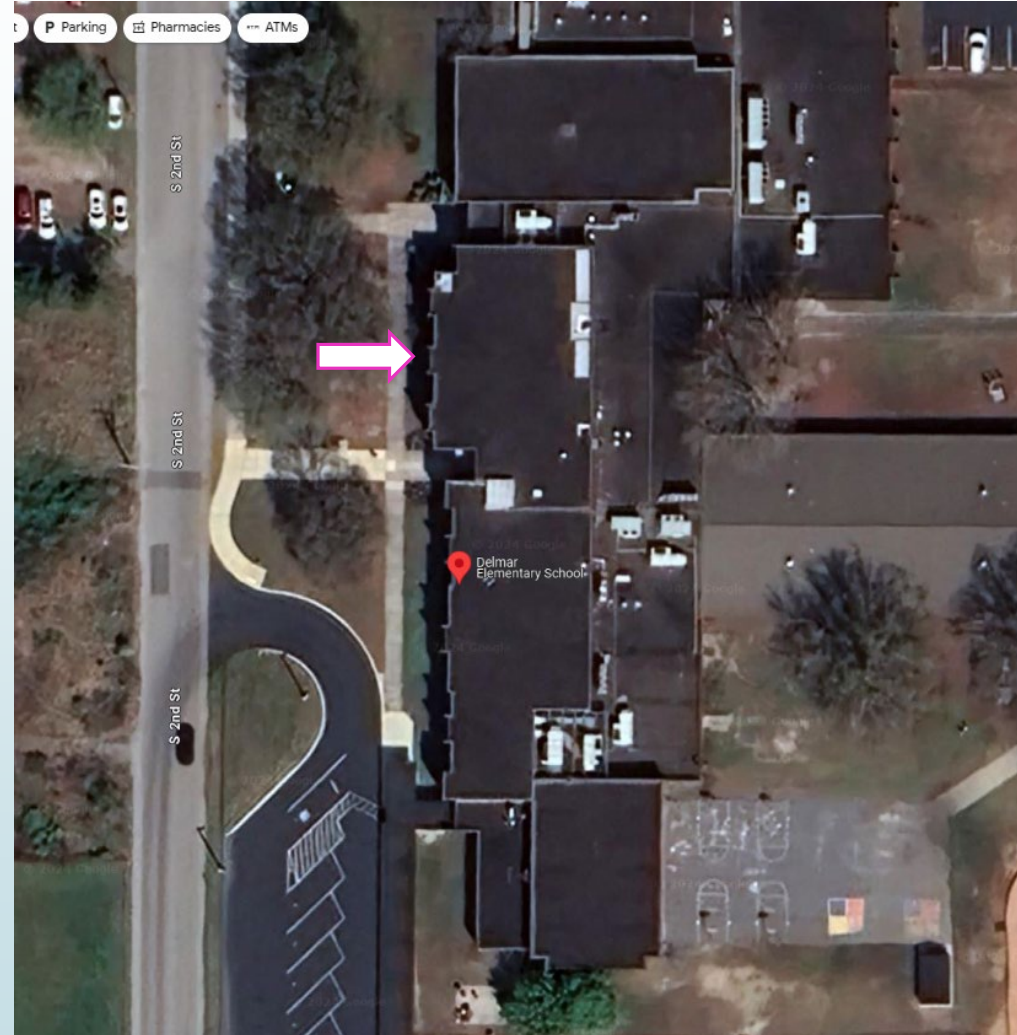

➤ Delmar Elementary :

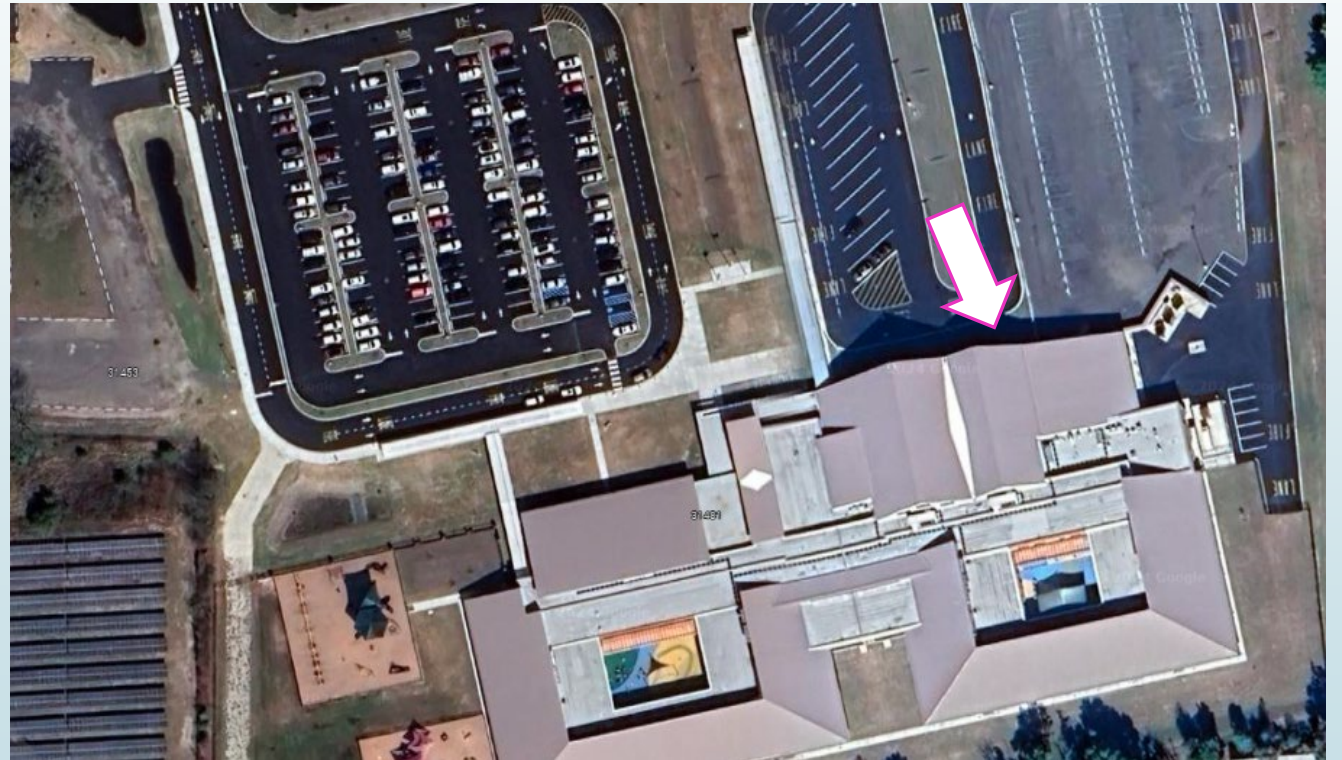
Drop off and pick up students in the cafeteria.

Camper Drop Off and Pick-Up

► Beaver Run:

Drop off and pick up students in the cafeteria. Use the entrance on the far left of the building.





Please Note: Only individuals on the pick-up list (The people specified on each camper's registration packet) will be authorized to pick up your child from camp. If someone needs to be added to that list, you must contact Catie Hamel 24 hours in advance of pick-up.

Identification must be provided at time of pick up. Adults will be told beforehand but remind them in the mornings, especially on day one.

Late Pick-Up Policy



- Parents who are regularly late to pick up their child from camp without notice to the camp counselors will be charged a late fee at the cost of **\$1.00 per minute.**
- If you are running late to pick up your child from camp you will be required to notify one of our camp counselors **ASAP.** All Camp Counselors will provide parents with a way to contact them during the camp day.
- Parents who are consistently late to pick up their child AND fail to follow the written lateness policy are at risk of losing their child's space at camp.
- **Please Note:** We understand things happen that may cause a parent to be late to pick-up. This policy is in effect for those who are consistently late without providing any kind of notice to the camp counselors. Your child will **not** be at risk of losing their camp spot for one-time lateness.

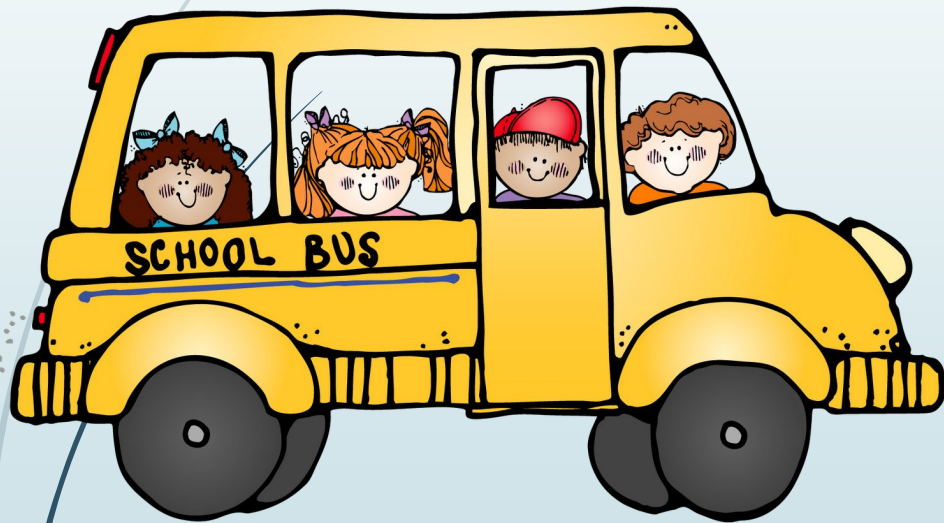


Field Trips

- Field Trips will be available on a first come, first serve basis to 50 campers. Due to limited transportation options this summer we have only been guaranteed one bus for our trips.
- Each Field Trip will cost \$25 per camper. The Field Trip forms must be turned in with payment in order to reserve your camper's spot.
- The first 30 campers from Delmar KKSE to turn in their field trip form will be able to go on that particular trip.
- The first 20 campers from Beaver Run KKSE to turn in their field trip form will be able to go on that particular trip.
- Your camper must be enrolled in the week of camp that the Field Trip falls on to be eligible to attend.
- Field Trip forms **MUST BE TURNED IN ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK (MONDAY) AT DROP OFF.**

Pool Days

- Pool days are ***EVERY FRIDAY! FREE!!***

- The bus will be picking us up at 8:30am and we will return to school at 12:30 pm.
- If you know you will be dropping off your child after the bus has already left, you will need to bring them to the Salvation Army for drop off. They will take the bus back to camp.
- Campers will need to pass a swim test to be able to swim in the deep end (Salvation Army policy).
- The Salvation Army pool will have a snack bar open during our trips. If you want your child to be able to purchase snacks please send them with money for this trip.

Pool Rules



Salvation Army Pool Rules

1. 100% NO running, at all.
2. NO horse playing in & out of the pool.
3. NO diving. Any entry into the pool that is head-first is considered a dive.
4. NO flipping into the pool.
5. NO running to enter the pool.
6. NO sitting on the pool steps.
7. NO foul language.
8. NOBODY is allowed to enter the building without shoes on.
9. NOBODY is permitted to sit in the red & white lifeguard chairs.
10. ONLY adults are allowed to sit in the pool chairs.
11. Please take ALL belongings out to the pool area when finished in the restroom. Anything left behind, will be thrown away.
12. ONLY lifeguards are permitted in the pool equipment room & pump room.
13. DO NOT enter the lifeguard office unless asked to enter.
14. NO bandages will be given to those that plan to return to the pool to swim.
15. NO hanging, climbing or pulling on the railing or fences in the pool area.
16. NOBODY is to enter the pool until the lifeguards have blown their whistle.
17. When on break, NOBODY is to be anywhere near the edge of the pool; including having your feet in the water.
18. NO child is allowed in the water greater than his or her chest!
19. In the kiddy pool area, NOBODY is allowed to sit, stand and/or walk on the edge of the wall near the fence.
20. NO playing in the locker room or shower areas.
21. NO eating in the locker rooms.
22. NO sitting on top of the picnic tables.
23. NO hanging or swimming on top of the rope that divides the deep end from the shallow end.
24. Swimmers MUST take a swim test in order to swim in the deep end.

For any infraction of the following rules, the camper will have to sit out of the pool for an automatic 15 minutes.

If lifeguards have to discipline a camper more than twice, then the camper will lose his or her privileges for the day.

- **7:30 am – 8:30 am:** Drop off and quiet free play
- **8:30 am – 8:45 am:** Morning meeting
- **8:45 am – 9:00 am:** Divide into smaller groups

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Meals/Snack Information

- **Snacks/Lunches** – Meals must be packed daily with an ice pack and plenty to drink. Each site will have a refrigerator available for use.
****Parents should be prepared to have their camper pack food every day.**
Please do not send lunches/snacks that need to be warmed up or prepared in any way at the camp.
- **Canteen Snacks** – There will be snacks on site that your child may purchase (Less than \$1.00 each). Those snacks include granola bars, popcorn, apple sauce, and juice. All proceeds go towards the end of the Summer Party.
- **Parties/Provided Lunches** – There may be some points during the Summer where we will provide free snacks/lunches for the campers. When that happens parents will be informed well in advance.

Cellphone/Electronics Policy

- ▶ All cellphones/electronics should be turned off and put away during camp.
- ▶ Parents are encouraged to contact the Camp Director or Camp Counselors if they need to speak with their child or organize pick-up.
- ▶ Wicomico County Recreation, Parks & Tourism is not responsible for any lost, damaged, or stolen electronic devices.



Items Campers Should Pack (Daily)

- Bathing Suit and flip flops/water shoes
- Towel
- Change of clothes
- Sunscreen (Sunscreen must be applied to child prior to camp each day. Please inform Counselors if they are NOT given permission to reapply sunscreen to your child)
- Trash bag for wet clothes/shoes
- Bug Spray
- Sneakers/Tennis shoes



**There will be indoor space at camp for your child to store a backpack with these items.

What NOT to bring to camp

- **What not to bring to camp**
- Weapons of any kind (real or fake)
- Pocket knives
- Cell phones and other electronics
- Things you are afraid of getting dirty



Lockdown/Evacuation/Fire Policy

- ▶ Lockdown/Evacuation drills and fire drills will be held weekly with campers. As there will be new campers attending each week and they will all need to understand our policies/procedures.
- ▶ Lockdown/Evacuation/Fire plans will be found at each Site. Camp staff will be available to go over those plans for parents who would like to be informed.
- ▶ In the event of a Lockdown/Evacuation/Fire situation Camp Staff will follow procedure laid out in our drills and parents will be notified immediately upon evacuation.



ACCIDENT/INJURY/ILLNESS REPORTS

➤ Accident Report:

- This report is taken if a child has an accident that causes a significant injury and seeks professional medical attention. For example, if a child trips and twists their ankle, an accident report will be filed. As the injury was significant.

➤ Injury Report:

- This report is taken if a child is mildly injured onsite and you have to provide medical attention yourself. For example, a child receives a bee sting and you use tweezers to pull out the stinger. You provide them with a band aid and an ice pack. Since the injury was mild you may fill out an injury report.

➤ Illness Report:

- This report is taken if a child falls ill onsite. This report is taken regardless if you provided medical attention or professional medical attention was sought out. For example, a child has a stomach ache and throws up in the bathroom. You call their parent and they are picked up early. For that you would fill out an illness report.

- **Accident Report = Severe injury that causes the child to seek professional medical attention.**

- **Injury Report = Mild/Moderate injury that a staff member treats onsite.**

- **Illness Report = Documentation when a child becomes sick onsite.**

Behavior Policy

- 1st and 2nd time: Verbal warning (1-3 times depending on the behavior) and/or removal from the current activity.
- 3rd time: **Green Write Up** and removal from activity for 5 – 10 minutes.
- 4th time: **Yellow Write-up** and a phone call to caregivers. (If the behavior continues after speaking with or leaving a message for parents the write-up will escalate to **Red Write-Up**.)
- A Severe Disruption: This is an automatic write-up.
- Severe disruption or misbehavior includes but is not limited to:
 - Cursing/inappropriate language
 - Physical violence with a participant or counselor
 - Misuse of equipment (Distruction of Property)
 - Attempting to run away from the site or leave the immediate area where staff is present
 - Bullying of ANY kind!

***Please note that the consequences for bad behavior will be determined by Camp Staff and the Program Director. Consequences will vary depending on the severity of the behavioral problems.*
