Not In Our Towns

You may have read in the news that there have been three instances of swastikas defacing school property in the Katonah Lewisboro School District. This follows an incident in Bedford at the end of last summer and other incidents in neighboring communities and school districts. In response to the most recent incident in Katonah Lewisboro the local clergy issued this statement.

In response to the recent anti-Semitic and bigoted hate crimes committed in our community, we the clergy of this community strongly condemn any and all such acts of hate. We believe that the memory of the Holocaust, and the passivity that made it possible, compel us all to be upstanders, not bystanders, for the cause of tolerance and acceptance of the diversity among us. We pledge ourselves to the sacred purpose of dispelling all forms of moral darkness within our community and beyond, and call upon our communities to stand with us.

In addition, to this statement we are distributing Not In Our Town magnets and decals as a way to say incidents like what happened in the Katonah Lewisboro schools are not the values we aspire to for our communities. (There is one on the hallway window near Fellowship Hall and one on my office.) If you would like a magnet for your car, please let us know and when they are ready (we are having more made!) we will make sure you get one.
