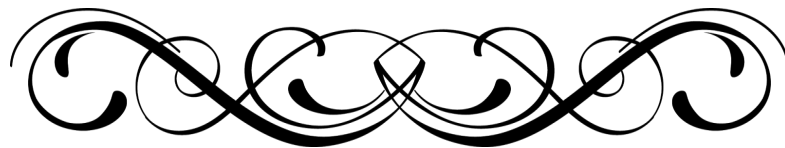

Carl's Dye-a-logue

In my office, I have a folded American flag and a shadow box with military decorations and some police identification cards and badges. Each of these were earned by my great-grandfather. My first name is in honor of him.

Carl W. Lenhart, Sr. was a service minded man. He served the United States in World War I & II (he actually lied about his age to volunteer to serve in WWI). He then served as a police officer in San Antonio before serving as Chief of Police in Alice, TX; Port Lavaca, TX; and Brady, TX.

Service was his legacy. It is what I remember about him ... well, that and angel food cake (a. k. a "Dodo cake"—"Dodo" was his grandfather name).

For most of us, the legacy we leave behind is important. We want our children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren to remember us for something positive. We want to know that we had a positive impact on the lives of those in our family.

What are you leaving behind for your descendants? I am not talking about a physical inheritance. I'm asking what is your legacy you are leaving behind?

Service to our country is a wonderful legacy. The flag, the decorations, etc. are wonderful reminders to me of Dodo's service to our country.

Service to our God, though, is the best legacy you can leave behind.
