# Carl's Dye-a-logue

On May 9, 1914 President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation recognizing the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. Prior to the Civil War and in the years following it, various women, including Julia Ward Howe and

Anna Jarvis, had sought to establish a day to honor mothers.

Jarvis desired Mother's Day to be an intimate occasion for a son or daughter honoring the mother they knew and loved. She did not want it to be a celebration of all mothers. For this reason, she always stressed the singular "Mother's" rather than the plural.

It did not take very long before Mother's Day became centered on the buying and giving of printed cards, flowers, candies and other gifts. It took on a life of its own.

Jarvis was so disillusioned by this commercialization of the holiday that she began a campaign against those who were profiting from Mother's Day.

Beginning in the 1920's she started actively campaigning against the holiday she helped establish. By the 1940's she had totally disavowed Mother's Day and even lobbied the government to have it removed from the calendar.

Jarvis died in 1948 in Philadelphia's Marshall Square Sanitarium. The holiday she helped establish, and then sought to remove, continues to grow even today.<sup>1</sup>

The story of Anna Jarvis' involvement with Mother's Day is a sad one to say the least. She did so much, worked so hard, and sacrificed so much . . . only to see what she wanted to see established "grow" into something she did not want it to become.

Sometimes I wonder if God does not feel the same way about the church? He did so much. He worked so hard. He sacrificed His Son to establish the church.

Yet for many, church has become something God never intended it to be: a place for fun, games, and entertainment instead of a place for sinners to worship and praise Him who made that precious sacrifice.

May we strive, not to change the church into what we want and think it should be, but to always stick to God's original design and plan for the church. May we never have our "lampstand removed from its place" (see Revelation 2:5).
