

Carl's Dye-a-logue

Most of the time when you look at the news it is bad. Whether you are watching it on broadcast TV, streaming it, or reading it in the newspaper or online . . . it seems that everything happening is bad. In some cases, if it is not bad

enough, the "newspeople" add a little hyperbole to make it seem worse.

Then, if the news is political in nature, it is really bad. You can tell what the political beliefs of the writer are based on the way the article is written (and sometimes just the headline). It seems the "newspeople" no longer just want to report the news they must editorialize everything.

Well, this past week I actually read something positive on a news site that typically provides and promotes bad news. It was a story from another country about a 12-year-old boy who was riding a bus to school (not a school bus, mind you). He had been given \$6.00 by his mother for his fare and lunch.

At the stop after he got on, a dirty, smelly woman got on the bus. The conductor began passing through the bus collecting fares. This elderly woman began looking in her bag. To make a long story short (too late!), she did not have the \$3.00 fare.

The conductor decided to be a jerk about it and loudly rebuked the woman and said the bus was not a "charity ride" and told the driver to stop, so they could throw her off the bus.

The boy was seated a couple of seats in front of the woman, and he turned around and gave the conductor his other \$3.00 and said it was the fare for the lady.

As it turns out, this lady was very wealthy. She had experienced car trouble and, while she was outside her car, had been splashed by a passing vehicle. She had forgotten her wallet in her car. At the end of the story, she reunites with the boy at his school and makes a sizable donation to the school and expects nothing in return, so long as they continue to turn out fine young people like this boy.

It is a feel-good story with a happy ending. There is a valid point (even if the story turns out to have been a "recycled" story from years ago).

The boy helped someone who needed help. He never expected to be repaid. He saw someone who was in need, and he met that need as he was able. His mom should be proud.

Someone else is proud when we do what we can for those in need. Read Matthew 25:31-46 to see who.
