Carl's Dye-a-logue

I find it fascinating how many times people feel they have the right to speak out on something that they really have no knowledge about . . . especially on social

media. Somebody reads or sees or hears about something without the proper context, and shares it with their friends on social media, where it is picked up by more people and soon we see it on news outlets that "everyone" is saying that such and such needs to be done.

Even more fascinating, to me, is when it involves sports. When I open my browser, I'm taken to a page that inevitably has this or that sports organization reacts to "whatever." Many times, it has to do with the officials of a hotly contested game where, at the end, some "controversial" call was made or not made that "determined" the outcome.

"Fans" watch in super slow motion and see that obviously something that happened in .01 seconds in real time should have been seen by the officials. As one who has officiated soccer, baseball, softball, and basketball, I can honestly tell you that officiating a contest, even at a junior high level, is much tougher than it looks.

Most of these complaining "fans" likely have never picked up a whistle. They sit in their own living rooms and want to criticize others who are doing something that they themselves never had the courage, ability, or desire to do.

Are we guilty of this in things that matter a little more than some game? Do we ever judge people who are different than we are? Do we ever look at someone and immediately determine they are corrupt? Do we ever figure that someone does not deserve to even be given the chance to be forgiven?

Perhaps we need to check the log that is in our own eye before criticizing the speck in someone else's eye (see Matthew 7:1-6). Perhaps we need to look with empathy upon people and realize that they are doing the best they can and cut them a little slack. Perhaps we should "walk a mile in their shoes" before we get mad and start talking (or typing).
