WHY WAIT UNTIL THE END OF THE YEAR?

There seems to be something very special about the end of one year and the beginning of a new year. It is so magical that many folks often make New Year's Resolutions. People say "this is going to be the time that I start something new, or this is going to be the time that I stop that particular habit". And so, we wait. Something that we ought to be doing "today" is put off until that future day when the year changes.

But what is the big deal about the first day of January? Why is that "the day" that seems to be the difference-maker? If there is something that is worth doing and will make a significant difference in our lives, why wait for another day beyond today?

Aren't you glad that God doesn't wait for New Year's Day? In the Old Testament, the Jews celebrated the Day of Atonement once every year. On that one day every year, the high priest would enter into the Most Holy Place with the blood of a bull and then he would lay his hands on the scapegoat, and the sins of the people would be remembered and then sent away into the wilderness on that day every year (**Heb. 10:3; 9:7; Lev. 16:1-34**). Not so today! A sinner's sins are removed at the point of baptism (**Acts 2:38; 22:16**), never to be remembered again (**Heb. 8:12**). A child of God's sins are removed continually during his faithful walk and confession of sins (**1 John 1:7, 9**), never to be remembered again (**Heb. 10:17**). God doesn't wait until a "move convenient season" to forgive! He forgives immediately! "The Lord is not slack" (**2 Pet. 3:9**)! If God doesn't wait, why do you?

So, if there is something that you need to change in your life, in order to be right with God, don't wait until New Year's Day. Don't wait until you "get everything worked out." Don't

Thanksgiving Appeal

To the church family at Beltline:

Despite the challenges presented in 2020 the Childhaven residents and staff have remained healthy and resilient. We have had no major outbreak on our campus and we continue to take what precautions we can to ensure the safety of our residents and staff. Our campus was "locked down" for sometime just prior to and during the summer. We have not been able to have some of the activities; special projects; and youth events on our campus that usually characterize Childhaven summers and holiday seasons, but we continue to be optimistic about resuming those things in 2021.

Our Annual Thanksgiving Appeal has also looked different this year. The impact of COVID-19 on Churches and the reactions have been varied as leaderships struggle to make the "right" decisions for the physical and spiritual health of their respective congregations. Thankfully, many congregations have found creative ways to continue to participate in our Thanksgiving Appeal and we hope that you can as well. The need remains great. Every bed within our current capacity is spoken for and we continue to get referrals, as more than 6,000 children are in foster care in the state at any given point. We hope to increase our capacity by having our Transitional Living Program staffed and that home furnished by May when six of our senior's graduate. We have a number of upcoming expenditures outside of our regular operating costs, ranging from: transportation expenses, to cottage roofing, to appliances and furnishings.
