Texas Flood Relief

Bottom Line Up Front:

Donation drive underway for Texas flooding victims.

Independence Day is a time of reflection and reverence where we remember the birth of a new nation impossible to found without the providence of God almighty. It is intended to be celebrated as a time of great sacrifice for a cause greater still. Sadly, this holiday will be sullied for many Texans in the years to come. It will remain in their hearts as a time of reflection and reverence, though for reasons more personal and bitter.

As you have likely heard, heavy flash flooding occurred in the Texan hill country the night of the 4th into the morning of the 5th. In the span of minutes, the Guadalupe River surged from its usual 1-5ft depth to a torrential 30ft sweeping away homes, trailer parks, RVs, and even a youth church camp. The casualty numbers are continuing to change by the hour. A true tragedy, more than 120 are confirmed deceased at the time of writing with 150 still missing. Kerr county was most sorely devastated. Families are starting over with nothing to their name, and in some cases, with less family members to do so.

In keeping with the Beltline character, we wish to be the hands and feet of Christ. We are currently accepting monetary donations. As always, it is our promise to you that we will put these funds to the best use available.


