Classroom Responsibilities

- Create and maintain a classroom culture based on the mission and values of the school

- Employ culturally responsive teaching practices that align with school's commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion
- Engage a variety of teaching strategies suitable to the developmental age and needs of the students and subject matter
- Understand the mission, values, and policies of the school and use these to identify and solve student, curricular, and school issues with appropriate professional conduct, keeping supervisors apprised

- Initiate growth and change for intellectual and professional development
