- ROSE SCALE** *Aulacaspis rosae* (Bouché) [Hemiptera: Diaspididae]. See Diaspididae. Cf. Asiatic Rose Scale; White Mango Scale.
- ROSE SLUG** *Endelomyia aethiops* (Fabricius) [Hymenoptera: Tenthredinidae].
- ROSE STEM-GIRDLER** *Agrilus aurichalceus* Redtenbacher [Coleoptera: Buprestidae].
- ROSEATE** Adj. (Latin, *rosa* = rose + *-atus* = adjectival suffix.) Rose coloured. Alt. Roseous; Roseus.
- ROSELLE, EUGENE JEAN BAPTISTE FERNAND DU (1854–1904)** (Hautefeuille 1905, Bull. Soc. linn. N. Fr. 17: 131–136.)

- ROSENHOF, AUGUST JOHANN ROESEL VON (1705–1759)** German miniature painter, natural historian and author of *Insecten Belustigungen* (4 vols, 1746–1761). Illustrations of insects among best of 18th century.
- ROSENKRANTZ, HANS FREDERICK (1822–1905)** (Engelhart 1918, Ent. Meddr. 12: 21–22.)
- ROSER, KARL V (1787–1861)** German natural historian and Director of Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Württemburg. Personal collection became foundation for entomological collection of Staatliches Museum für Naturkunde, Stuttgart.
- ROSETTE** Noun. (French, from Latin, *rosa*; diminutive of rose.) 1. A short, bunched type of plant growth. 2. A cluster of leaves that arise in a small circle from a central axis on a stem or branch. 3. Any group of appendages (similar in size and shape) basally attached to a structure.
- ROSIN** Noun. (Middle English variant of resin. PL, Rosins.) A hard, brittle, amber coloured to black, tasteless residue from distillation of volatile oil of turpentine. Used to manufacture soap and varnish, serves as a flux for soldering and for rosining bow of some stringed musical instruments. See Resin.
- ROSNER, JOSEPH (1860–1920)** (Hedwig 1921, Jh. Ver. Schles. Insektenk. 13: 23.)
- ROSORIAL** Adj. (Etymology obscure.) Pertaining to rodents; Rodentine. Gnawing.
- ROSPIN®** See Chlorpropylate.
- ROSS RIVER FEVER** A non-fatal arboviral disease endemic in Australia and now widespread in Pacific islands. RRF caused by *Alphavirus* of Tongaviridae; enzootic in marsupials, horses and cattle. Mosquito vectors include *Aedes* spp. and *Culex annulirostris*. Disease manifest in headache, fever, arthralgia and rash. See Arbovirus; Tongaviridae. Cf. Chikungunya; O’Nyong-Nyong; Sindbis.
- ROSS, RONALD (1857–1932)** Pioneer in Medical Entomology; among other accomplishments, Ross first described complete life cycle of bird malaria. (Bonn 1932, Genesk. Tijdschr. Nederl. Ind. 72: 1330; Watson 1933, Sci. Progr. 27: 377–395; Wenyon 1933, Trans. R. Soc. trop. Med. Hyg. 26: 473–478.)
- ROSS, TERRY SPINKS (1903–1928)** (Plank 1928, J. Econ. Ent. 21: 440.)
- ROSSI, GUSTAV DE (-1903)** (Anon. 1903, Wien. Ent. Ztg. 22: 36.)
- ROSSI, PIETRO (1738–1804)** Italian academic, naturalist and author of *Fauna Insecta quae in Provinciis Florentina et Pisana praesertim collegit* (2 vols, 1790) and *Mantissa Insectorum exhibens species nuper in Etruria collectas* (2 vols, 1792–1794.)
