We have reviewed the above referenced project to determine its effects to cultural resources. As required by Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as amended, and its implementing regulations, 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties," we submit our comments.

According to the submitted information, WV Division of Highways is proposing to fund the reconstruction of existing sidewalks and steps throughout the town of Farmington, Marion County, West Virginia.

Archaeological Resources:

A search of our records located no known archaeological sites within the proposed project area. According to submitted project information, the project's proposed construction activities will be confined to previously disturbed areas where it is unlikely that intact archaeological deposits are present. In our opinion, there are no archaeological sites located within the proposed project area that are eligible for or listed in the National Register of Historic Places. If, however, cultural materials are encountered during construction, all activity shall cease within the discovery area and our office shall be contacted immediately.

Architectural Resources:

A search of our records indicated that there are no architectural or structural resources eligible for or listed in the National Register of Historic Places will be effected by the proposed project. We also have reviewed the photos submitted with the application. Therefore, it is our opinion that the project will not effect any architectural or structural resources eligible for or listed in the National Register of Historic Places. No further consultation is necessary.
