**Big 12 Men's Basketball 2003-04 Wrap Up**

**Big 12 Men's Basketball Resume in 2003-04**

- Oklahoma State gave the Big 12 its third straight NCAA Tournament Final Four appearance. In 2002 Kansas and Oklahoma represented the league in the Final Four and last season Texas and Kansas reached the same plateau with KU finishing runner-up. Oklahoma State becomes the fifth Big 12 team to reach the NCAA Tournament Final Four in the last three years.
- Iowa State made its first appearance in the NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden. The Cyclones are the second straight Big 12 team to make the NIT semifinals. In 2003 Texas Tech placed third in the NIT. Iowa State finished eighth in the 2004 Big 12 regular season.
- There were more Big 12 teams in the Top 10 of the final USA TODAY Coaches's Poll than any other conference. The 2004 poll, released after the NCAA Tournament, had Oklahoma State No. 4, Kansas No. 9, and Texas No. 10. This marks the second straight year the Big 12 has had three teams in the coaches' Top 10 as Kansas was No. 2, Texas No. 3, and Oklahoma No. 7 in 2003.
- The Big 12 has had six or more teams post 20 or more wins in each of the last four seasons, including six in 2003-04. There have been six or more 20-win Big 12 teams during five of the eight years the league has existed (with four of those in the past four seasons).
- Big 12 sends a record nine teams into postseason play in 2004 – NCAA – Kansas, Oklahoma State, Texas, Texas Tech; and NIT – Colorado, Iowa State, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma.
- The Big 12's 10-3 (76.9 percent) record in the 2004 NCAA Tournament is the highest winning percentage of any other league in this year's field. The ACC is next at 13-4 (76.5 percent).
- Five different Big 12 teams have been ranked in the Associated Press Top 10 during the 2003-04 season – Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas.
- Six different Big 12 teams were ranked during the 2003-04 season.
- The Big 12 has had five teams ranked in the same Associated Press poll in seven of the 19 polls released this season. At least four league teams have been ranked in 15 of the 19.
- The Big 12's average seed for the 2004 NCAA Tournament is 4.2, the lowest in the eight-year history of the conference.
- The Big 12 has had seven teams in the last three NCAA Tournament regional finals – i.e. Elite Eight - Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma in 2003; Kansas, Texas in 2003; and Oklahoma State, Kansas in 2004.
- Big 12 posted a combined 7-2 record in first-round postseason games in 2004.

**What's Back for Next Season**

Two first team and 13 total All-Big 12 selections currently are scheduled to return for 2004-05. Additionally, John Lucas of Oklahoma State, the Associated Press Big 12 Player of the Year will be back for his senior campaign. OSU teammate Joey Graham (Big 12 coaches) and Kansas State's Jeremiah Massey (AP) were each named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year will return as will Iowa State's Curtis Stinson the Big 12 Freshman of the Year.

**Big 12 Sent All-Time High Nine Teams Into Postseason**

**Oklahoma State Wins Its First Big 12 Regular Season Title**

Preseason No. 5 by the coaches and the media, Oklahoma State proved the critics wrong in posting a 14-2 record to win its first ever Big 12 regular season title. The regular season championship was the first league title for OSU since it tied Kansas for the 1991 Big Eight crown. The Cowboys finished two games ahead of runner-up Texas (12-4) and Kansas (12-4) to win their first outright conference season title since the 1965 Big Eight crown. This season marked the 17th overall conference crown for Oklahoma State. Cowboy senior Tony Allen garnered Big 12 Player of the Year honors by the conference coaches while junior teammate John Lucas was the Associated Press league player of the year.

**Oklahoma State Wins First Phillips 66 Big 12 Tournament Title**

Oklahoma State swept Iowa State (83-75), Texas Tech (82-77), and No. 11 Texas (65-49) to win its first Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Tournament at the American Airlines Center in Dallas. For OSU it was its second tournament championship game appearance with the other in 1999 when it lost to Kansas. The 2004 crown also marked the fourth time in the eight year history of the conference the No. 1 seed won the title - Kansas in 1997, Kansas, in 1998, Iowa State in 2000, and Oklahoma State in 2004. Higher seeds prevailed in the event as there was only one lower seed to claim a win – No. 5 Texas Tech over No. 4 Colorado 79-69. Oklahoma State senior Tony Allen was named most outstanding player of the event. Joining him on the all-tournament team were Kansas junior Wayne Simien, Texas senior Brandon Mouton, and the Oklahoma State duo of juniors Joey Graham and John Lucas.

**11 Different Big 12 Teams Advance to Postseason Play**

In eight seasons of men's basketball, there have been 11 different Big 12 teams advancing to postseason play. The conference has averaged 5.3 teams in the NCAA Tournament and 2.0 in the NIT. In 2002 Kansas and Oklahoma became the first Big 12 teams to reach the NCAA Tournament Final Four since the conference started in 1996-97. Kansas and Texas accomplished the same feat last season with Kansas losing in the championship game. Kansas and is the only team in the Big 12 to have participated in all eight NCAA tourneys during the league's tenure. Colorado, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Oklahoma State have participated in both the NCAA Tournament and the NIT. Texas and Oklahoma have been in seven of eight NCAA tourneys and Iowa State in three since 1997. Baylor became the 10th league school by advancing to the NIT in 2001 and Texas Tech the 11th in the NCAA Tournament in 2002. The six Big 12 teams in the 2003 NCAA Tournament carried the highest seed average (4.3) until 2004 with a 4.2 average. The 2000 advancing NCAA teams is next with a combined 5.0 seed average.

**Hosting NCAA Tournament Play**

The Big 12 Conference will play host to the 2005 NCAA Tournament First/Second Rounds at the Ford Center in Oklahoma City. Ticket information for the event will be available at the Big 12 website – [www.big12sports.com](http://www.big12sports.com) following the 2004 NCAA tourney. Since the league began, either the conference office or a league institution has played host to the NCAA Tournament every year except 1999. That continues through the 2006 event when the league office and Texas host two sites.

**Tickets for the 2005 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament First/Second Rounds Games in Oklahoma City are on Sale Now**

Ticket applications for the 2005 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament First/Second Rounds, set for March 18 and 20 in Oklahoma City's Ford Center, are available. The 2005 event will mark the second time in three years the Ford Center has hosted the prestigious early rounds of the NCAA Tournament. The 2003 event sold out in the earliest stages. Tickets for the six-game, three-session tournament are \$150 each, with a \$4 per order service charge. There is a limit of four tickets per application, but patrons may submit multiple applications. The service charge will not apply to ticket applications delivered in person to the Ford Center box office or unsuccessful applicants. Applications were accepted until April 27, 2004, and have been followed by the random selection process. Applications are available at the Ford Center box office, the Oklahoma City All Sports Association, the Big 12 Conference office in Dallas, or downloaded from the conference web site at [www.big12sports.com](http://www.big12sports.com).

**Big 12 Men's Basketball Notables**

- Including 2004, Big 12 teams have made 34 Final Four appearances, with 15 of those advancing to the national championship game. Five of the 34 appearances have come in the last three seasons – Kansas and Oklahoma in 2002; Kansas and Texas in 2003; and Oklahoma State in 2004. There have been four NCAA champions (Kansas in 1988, 1952; Oklahoma State in 1946, 1945). In the past 17 seasons there have been 10 Final Four appearances by Big 12 teams. Included is the 1988 tourney when Kansas defeated Oklahoma in the championship game. Eight of the league's schools have reached the Final Four – Baylor (2), Colorado (2), Iowa State (1), Kansas (12), Kansas State (4), Oklahoma (4), Oklahoma State (6), Texas (3).
- Since 1992 Big 12 schools have averaged nearly eight teams advancing to postseason play. Three times during that span — 1992, 1995, 2004 — nine Big 12 schools were in postseason play. The league has had at least seven advance in 10 of the last 12 years.
- In eight seasons of men's basketball, there have been 11 different Big 12 teams advancing to postseason play. Kansas is the only league team to have participated in all eight NCAA tourneys during the league's tenure. Colorado, Iowa State, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Oklahoma State have participated in both the NCAA Tournament and the NIT. Texas and Oklahoma have been in seven of eight NCAA tourneys. Baylor became the 10th league school by advancing to the NIT in 2001 and Texas Tech the 11th in the NCAA Tournament in 2002.
- In 1996, Nebraska became the third Big 12 team to win the postseason National Invitation Tournament and the first since Texas won the 1978 event. Colorado won the 1940 NIT. In all, the Big 12 Conference has made seven appearances in the NIT championship game. In 2003 Texas Tech became the first team since the league began to make the postseason NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden. The Red Raiders ended third in the event. Iowa State is the second to have reached the semifinals in 2004.
- The Big 12 has had nine different schools represented (Colorado, Iowa State, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma State, Oklahoma, Texas, and Texas Tech) in the last nine season-ending Associated Press polls.
- Kansas has appeared in the final Top 10 Associated Press rankings 10 of the last 13 years, including No. 1 in the 1997 final AP poll. The Jayhawks were No. 2 in the final AP poll of 1998 (March 10), No. 2 in 2002 (March 11), and No. 6 in 2003 (March 17).
- Oklahoma State, Oklahoma, Iowa State, Missouri, Texas, and Texas Tech join Kansas in having appeared in the final Top 10 polls to give the Big 12 at least one Top 10 team in 13 of the last 14 final Associated Press Polls (since the 1990-91 season). The Cowboys' No. 4 in the final AP poll of 2003-04 matches their highest AP finish with the 1995 Final Four team. Last year Oklahoma was No. 3 in the final AP poll with Texas No. 5 and Kansas No. 6. Iowa State was No. 10 following the 2000-01 season and No. 6 in the final AP poll of 1999-00. Missouri ended No. 5 following the 1993-94 season, and Texas Tech was No. 8 in 1995-96. Kansas was No. 2 in 1991-92, No. 9 in 1992-93, No. 5 in 1994-95, No. 4 in 1995-96, No. 1 in 1996-97, No. 2 in 1997-98, and No. 2 in 2001-02.
- In 2002-03 Texas' T.J. Ford and Kansas' Nick Collison each earned national player of the year honors. Ford was honored with the Naismith Award, Wooden Award, Sporting News Player of the Year, and Sports Illustrated Player of the Year. Collison was the NABC Player of the Year. In 2001-02 Kansas' Drew Gooden was named the Co-NABC Player of the Year with Duke's Jason Williams.

- Since 1996-97, a Big 12 player has been named consensus All-America eight times. The league has had two consensus first team All-America players on the same team in three of the seven seasons of the conference — 2003 (Nick Collison of Kansas and T.J. Ford of Texas); 2000 (Chris Mihm of Texas and Marcus Fizer of Iowa State); and 1998 (Raef LaFrentz and Paul Pierce of Kansas). Texas Tech's Andre Emmett was a consensus All-American in 2003-04 as was Drew Gooden of Kansas in 2001-02. Overall, student-athletes from Big 12 institutions have been named first-team All-America 172 times, including 12 times since the start of the conference in 1996-97.
- Since 1992 there have been four coaches from Big 12 institutions who have been named national Associated Press Coach of the Year. Iowa State's Larry Eustachy was the 2000 AP Coach of the Year, joining Roy Williams of Kansas (1992), Norm Stewart of Missouri (1994) and Kelvin Sampson of Oklahoma (1995). *Note: Texas Tech's Bob Knight was the AP Coach of the Year three times while at Indiana (1975, 1976, 1989), and Oklahoma State's Eddie Sutton won the honor while at Arkansas in 1978 and at Kentucky in 1986. The AP Coach of the Year began following the 1966-67 season.*
