MATCHUP NOTEBOOK.....

Colorado (2005, '04, '02, '01) and Texas (2005, '01, '99, '96) are both playing in their fourth title game overall, tying Oklahoma for the most appearances in league history. The Buffaloes have represented the North Division in four of the last five contests, while the Longhorns are making their first appearance since 2001.

CU downed Texas, 39-37, at Texas Stadium in Irving in the 2001 Big 12 title game.

This marks the fifth time that the championship game participants have played during the regular season. The previous four second games between teams were in 1999 (Nebraska-Texas), 2000 (Kansas State-Oklahoma), 2001 (Colorado-Texas) and 2002 (Colorado-Oklahoma). The Sooners are the only team to defeat an opponent twice in one season, downing K-State in 2000 and Colorado in 2002.

Texas has run the table at 8-0 in the South Division for the first time in school history. UT is the sixth squad to post an unbeaten conference record entering the championship game. The others were Oklahoma (2004, '03), Kansas State (1998) and Nebraska (1997, '96).

The South has a slight edge in the previous nine title contests, holding a 5-4 advantage. North and South Teams have alternated wins in the first nine years of the game. A South squad (Oklahoma) won a year ago.

The designated home team in each of the first six Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship games (1996-01) was the winning squad. The visiting team has won two of the last three contests. The Buffaloes are the home team for this year's title event.

The Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship game has been held at five different sites in its history. Houston's Reliant Stadium is hosting for the second time, the only venue besides Kansas City's Arrowhead Stadium to host more than once since 1998.

At least one participant in the game has been ranked among the top eight nationally in both the Associated Press and USA TODAY/ESPN national polls in each of the 10 Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championships. Texas is No. 2 in the polls this year.

Seventeen of the 20 squads in the championship contest have been ranked at the time of the engagement. In addition, Texas jumped from unranked to No. 20 in the next AP survey after upsetting then-No. 3 Nebraska, 37-27, at St. Louis in 1996.

DID YOU KNOW?? BIG 12 FOOTBALL

- The Big 12 has sent eight teams to bowl games in four of the last five seasons, including 2005.
- From 2000-05, Big 12 teams have participated in 46 bowl games.
- For the first time in league history, five North Division teams will participate in bowls, marking only the second time five teams from one division have gone "bowling" (South, 2004).
- All-time, the South Division is 95-85 vs. the North, including an 11-7 mark in 2005.
- The South Division held an average score advantage of 29.6-to-25.2 vs. the North in the 18 games played this season.
- Seventeen of the 20 Big 12 Championship game participants have been nationally-ranked.
- Average attendance at member institutions this season was 58,506 over 71 games, an increase of 2.1 percent over last season (57,312 over 72 games).
- Average attendance has increased 13.7 percent from the first year of Big 12 play to the present season.
- Average attendance has increased in six of the conference's 10 years, including each of the last two.

Rushing to the Top

For the first time in Big 12 history, a quarterback can finish the season as the Conference's leading rusher. Currently, Missouri's Brad Smith sits atop the league rushing chart (1,151 yards, 104.6 per game), followed by Oklahoma sophomore running back Adrian Peterson (1,024 yards, 102.4 ypg).

Tough Sledding

Four teams in the Big 12 (Colorado, Kansas, Iowa State, Oklahoma) are holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing per game. All four rank in the top 14 nationally.

BAYLOR (5-6, 2-6)

End of Season

Baylor posted two Big 12 wins in a season for the first time ever. The Bears won five games for the first time since the 1995 team won seven.

Baylor finished the season with 10 rushing touchdowns, the most by a Baylor team since the Bears had 16 in 2002.

Free safety Maurice Lane finished his career with 365 tackles, third all-time at BU.

Shawn Bell established a Baylor record for completions in a season. He finished with 190, breaking the longest-standing single-season record at Baylor (Don Trull, 174, 1963). Bell has 3,804 career yards passing, eighth all-time at BU.



COLORADO (7-4, 5-3)

This Week: Big 12 Championship
Next: Bowl Game

Colorado has advanced to the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship for the fourth time in the last five years and will play Texas Saturday in Reliant Stadium.

Joel Klatt upped his career passing yards total to 7,608, which moved him past Oklahoma's Josh Heupel (7,456) into fifth place all-time in the conference. He has 2,596 yards for the season, the first CU player to throw for consecutive 2,500-yard seasons.

Hugh Charles has 806 yards rushing in 2005, the 10th-most by a sophomore in school history.

Nebraska rushed for 105 yards as a team, only the third time in 11 games this year an opponent went over the century mark (Miami and Texas did so as well).



IOWA STATE (7-4, 4-4)

Next: Bowl Game

The Cyclones are bowl-eligible for the fifth time in the last six years.

Iowa State has won at least seven games in a season for the 13th time in 114 years of ISU football. Head coach Dan McCarney has coached five of those teams.

With the retirement of Kansas State's Bill Snyder, McCarney, in his 11th season, is now the dean of Big 12 head coaches. He is the winningest coach in school history with 52 victories.

ISU is fourth in the nation with a +15 turnover margin.

Bret Meyer had a school-record string of 155 consecutive pass attempts without an interception before it was broken against Kansas.



KANSAS (6-5, 3-5)

Next: Bowl Game

KU went undefeated/untied at home for the first time since 1951 and is bowl eligible for the second time in three seasons.

With his 12 tackles against Iowa State, senior Nick Reid became just the 10th player in the history of the Big 12 to record 400 career tackles and now sits in eighth place on the league's all-time list with 410. He also has the team's longest starting streak at 41 games, dating back to his freshman season.

The Jayhawks limited Iowa State to 56 rushing yards to bring KU's opponent season average to 88.1 yards per game on the ground, shattering the school record of 109.2 set in 1948. Kansas ranks fourth in the nation in rush defense.

KU has forced at least one turnover in 30 of its last 35 games.



KANSAS STATE (5-6, 2-6)

End of Season

With its win in the season finale Kansas State has won 13 straight games over Missouri and sent head coach Bill Snyder into retirement on a winning note. Snyder ends his KSU career with a 136-68-1 record over 17 seasons.

Kansas State has scored in 115 straight games, dating back to the 1996 Colorado game. The scoring streak is currently the 13th-longest in the nation.

Thomas Clayton rushed for 102 yards in the season-finale vs. Missouri, breaking the 100-yard mark for the third time in 2005.

Jordy Nelson's eight touchdown receptions this season are the seventh-most in single-season history and his 38 receptions were the second-most by a K-State sophomore wide receiver.



MISSOURI (6-5, 4-5)

Next: Bowl Game

Tight end Chase Coffman's 33-yard touchdown catch against Kansas State in the regular-season finale was his first since the second game of the season. Coffman matched his career high with six catches for a career-high 88 yards.

Tight end Martin Rucker also had a career day against K-State with nine catches for 112 yards and a touchdown.

Brad Smith added to his Big 12 total offense career record with 319 yards, 248 passing and 71 rushing. He now has 12,656 total yards in his career.

Smith leads the Big 12 and is 27th nationally with 104.6 rushing yards per game. He is one of only two (OU's Adrian Peterson, 102.4) conference players to average over 100 yards a game on the ground.

Missouri is bowl-eligible for the second time in the last three years.



NEBRASKA (7-4, 4-4)

Next: Bowl Game

Nebraska's 392 passing yards in the Colorado game gives it 2,525 passing yards in 2005, a single-season record. The previous record was 2,431 yards in 1972.

The Husker defense held CU to 212 yards, the fewest it has allowed since the season opener when it held Maine to 145.

Zac Taylor's 392 yards passing pushed his Nebraska single-season passing record to 2,486 yards. The 392 yards are the second-best single-game passing total in school history, and just the fourth 300-yard-plus passing game in Nebraska school history.



OKLAHOMA (7-4, 6-2)

Next: Bowl Game

Oklahoma rushed for 354 yards against OSU, the team's best ground game since the 2002 season opener against Tulsa when the Sooners rushed for 378 yards.

Rhett Bomar threw three touchdown passes, his first career game with multiple touchdown passes.

Adrian Peterson's 210 second-half rushing yards are the most all-time by a Sooner in any half. Peterson had touchdown runs of 84 and 71 yards. He went over the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second time in as many seasons.

OU has held eight opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, including four under 25 yards.



OKLAHOMA STATE (4-7, 1-7)

End of Season

Mike Hamilton set an OSU freshman rushing record, finishing the season with 961 yards. His 87.4 yards per game average is third in the conference and 46th nationally.

D'Juan Woods caught four passes for 39 yards in the season finale at Oklahoma, extending his streak of games with a reception to 21. He increased his season receptions total to 56 - the seventh-best single season total in school history.

Donovan Woods, who began the season as the starting quarterback before switching to defensive back, made a career-high seven tackles against the Sooners and intercepted a pass.

Julius Crosslin scored two touchdowns against OU to improve his season total to a team-leading 12. He is sixth in the Big 12 in scoring



TEXAS (11-0, 8-0)

This Week: Big 12 Championship
Next: Bowl Game

The Longhorns have clinched the Big 12 South Division title and will play in the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship game Saturday in Houston's Reliant Stadium.

Texas finishes the regular season undefeated for the 13th time in its history.

UT has scored 40 or more points in the last nine games, and in 10 out of the 11 games this season. Texas leads the nation in scoring with 49.2 points per game.

Vince Young now has 3,369 total offensive yards in 2005 to rank first in the UT career record books for yards in a season.

Michael Griffin set a UT record with his fifth career blocked punt.



TEXAS A&M (5-6, 3-5)

End of Season

Quarterback Reggie McNeal, who missed the Texas game with an injury, finished his A&M career as the school's career record holder in passing yards (6,992) and total offense (8,881). He finished No. 2 on the quarterback career rushing chart (1,889), No. 3 in career passing touchdowns (44), completions (478) and attempts (875).

The Aggies rushed for 277 yards, the most of any Texas opponent this season. Stephen McGee (108) and Jorvorskie Lane (104) became only the second A&M duo to each rush for 100 yards against Texas, joining Bucky Richardson (25-150) and Darren Lewis (16-109), who did it in 1990. The last freshman quarterback to rush for 100 yards for A&M was Richardson (8-137) against Rice in 1987.

A&M held Texas to a season-low 336 offensive yards, ending a streak of three straight 600-yard games and eight straight 400-yard efforts.



TEXAS TECH (9-2, 6-2)

Next: Bowl Game

Texas Tech's nine-win regular season is its first since 1976 when Tech won 10 regular-season games. The Red Raiders' six conference wins are their most since competing in the Big 12.

Taurean Henderson has four 100-plus yard rushing games on the season and 10 in his career. His 22 touchdowns lead the Big 12.

The Red Raiders went 7-0 at Jones SBC Stadium this season and will go into 2006 riding a nine-game home win streak. The nine-game streak is the longest since Tech registering 11-straight between Sept. 15, 1973, and Nov. 23, 1974.

Texas Tech has outscored opponents 224-99 in the first half this season, including a 100-30 first quarter advantage.

Instant Replay

The Big 12 has two main principles with regard to review:

- A standard of **indisputable video evidence** for any on-field call to be changed;
- A review must have a **direct, competitive effect** on the game, such as a change of possession, scoring play, etc.

Plays that **MAY** be reviewed with the use video replay:

1. Plays governed by sideline, goal line and end line:

- a) Scoring plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line.
- b) Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line.
- c) Runner/receiver in or out of bounds.
- d) Recovery of loose ball in bounds.

2. Passing Plays:

- a) Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
- b) Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver.
- c) Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
- d) Quarterback (passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, the play is finalized).
- e) Illegal forward pass or illegal handing beyond the line of scrimmage.
- f) Illegal forward pass or illegal handing after change of possession.
- g) Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage.

3. Other detectable infractions:

- a) Runner ruled not down.
- b) Forward progress errors with respect to first down.
- c) Touching of a kick.
- d) Number of players on field.
- e) Clock adjustments.
- f) Fourth-down/try fumble plays.

Plays that **MAY NOT** be reviewed with the use of video replay:

1. Holding.
2. Offside/encroachment.
3. Pass interference.
4. Personal fouls (e.g., late hits).
5. Illegal blocks.
6. Illegal formations.
7. Face mask.
8. Taunting/excessive celebration.
9. False starts.
10. Roughing the passer/kicker.
11. Fighting participants.
