

2006 Big 12 Softball Championship ASA Hall of Fame Stadium Oklahoma City, Okla. ~ May 10

Game 2 -- #7 Missouri 6, #10 Texas Tech 3 (Texas Tech eliminated)

Centerfielder Micaela Minner and pitcher Jen Bruck each doubled in two RBI to lead seventh seed Missouri to a 6-3 win over 10th seed Texas Tech in a play-in game at the Big 12 Softball Championship.

Texas Tech opened the scoring in the top of first when designed player Brandy Moulin doubled in leftfielder Devin Zaragoza. MU came back with two runs in the bottom of the inning to take the lead for good when Miner doubled in rightfielder Janessa Roening and leftfielder Leanne Bowers.

The Tigers added two more runs in both the third and fourth innings to take a 6-1 lead. Bruck doubled in Roening and Bowers in the third inning. In the fourth shortstop Andee Allen scored on a throwing error while catcher Kathy Masterson scored on a Roening single.

Texas Tech put together a comeback in the top of the seventh as Brooke Neuman and Heather Parker both scored, but it wasn't enough.

Bruck (22-19) went the distance for Missouri, giving up three runs, two earned, while recording five strikeouts and three base on balls. Erin Crawford (11-18) took the loss for Texas Tech with four earned runs in two innings. Julie Hauck gave up two runs, one earned, in three innings while Sarah Losleben gave up no hits in a scoreless sixth inning.
