Courtney Paris won her second consecutive Big 12 Tournament MVP.

Oklahoma had three athletes on the all-tournament team for the second consecutive year.

Oklahoma started the game on an 11-0 run.

Courtney Paris recorded her 58th consecutive double-double. She has 63 double-doubles in 66 career games.

Courtney Paris had 20+ points and 20+ rebounds for the third time this season.

Oklahoma has won eight straight games.

Jenna Plumley set her career-high for steals in a game with six. Her previous career-high was five which she tied in the first half.

Oklahoma started the game 8-of-11 from the field. They finished the half shooting 3-of-27.

Courtney Paris has a block in every game this season.

Oklahoma is 3-3 when trailing at the half.

Leah Rush tied her season-high with 18 points. She has scored in double-figures for the 15th time this season.

Leah Rush scored 15+ points for the 4th time this season.

Erin Higgins tied Rene Hanebutt for most career 3-point field goals in the Big 12 Championships. She has made 28 shots from beyond the arc.

Oklahoma snapped an Iowa State eight game-winning streak.

IOWA STATE

After trailing 11-0, Iowa State finished the first half on a 26-12.

Alison Lacey scored in double-figures for the 12th time this season.

Iowa State has made a 3-pointer in 367 consecutive games.

Lyndsey Medders scored in double-figures for the 20th time this season.

Lyndsey Medders passed Stephanie Smith for seventh-most field goal attempts in a season. Medders has taken 411 shots.

Megan Ronhovde tied her season-high with nine rebounds.

Iowa State took its first lead of the game with 1:25 left in the first half.

Iowa State held Sooner point guard Jenna Plumley scoreless in the first half. Plumley scored a careerhigh 24 points in the semifinal game.

Iowa State is 19-2 when leading at the half.

Five different Cyclones made 3-pointers.
