## Henry Dugat



- Baylor returns four of its five starters from last season and nearly all of its statistical production for the second straight year. The Bears welcome back 86.7 percent of last season's points, 87.0 percent of rebounds, and 82.0 percent of assists.
- A year ago, BU made its first NCAA Championship appearance since 1988 and only its second since 1950. Baylor has never made the championship in consecutive seasons, and has only advanced five times in program history.
- BU averaged 81.3 points in 2007-08 to lead the Big 12 and rank 11th nationally. Baylor's 2,601 total points were a school record.
- A consensus All-Big 12 First Team pick in 2008, senior guard Curtis Jerrells became the 20th player in school history to eclipse the 1,000-point career plateau. This season, the Bears could have as many as four players join the 1,000-point club.
- Sophomore LaceDarius Dunn was one of the nation's top freshmen last year. He finished second on the team with 13.6 points per game, while being named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team.
- Baylor's roster returns three All-Big 12 performers from a year ago (Jerrells, Henry Dugat and Kevin Rogers). The three All-Big 12 honorees for BU tied for its most in one season in Big 12 history.

### Quincy Acy, F, 6-7, 205, Mesquite, Texas/Horn

- Averaged 17.8 points, 7.8 rebounds and 3.0 blocks his senior season.
- Named District 12-5A Defensive Player of the Year.
- Ranked as No. 80 overall prospect in 2009 Rivals.com Top 150 and No. 22 power forward in the country. He was also listed as No. 4 in the TexasHoops.com top 100.

### Fred Ellis, F, 6-6, 205, Sacramento, Calif./Sacramento

- Redshirted during the 2007-08 season.
- Dubbed the "biggest sleeper" recruit in the summer of 2006 by Scout.com.
- Third-team All-State selection as a senior in 2007 after averaging 17.4 points and 8.0 rebounds.

### Anthony Jones, F, 6-10, 186, Houston, Texas/Yates

- One of BU's highest-ranked recruits in program history, selected as a top 50 prospect by eight national recruiting services.
- Averaged 13.3 points, 4.9 rebounds and 3.1 blocks for Yates as a senior.
- Garnered 2008 EA Sports second team All-American, TABC Class 4A All-State, and All-District 20-4A honors after helping lead his team to a district title and into the ESPN High Elite 25 national rankings.

### Kendall Wright, G, 6-0, 180, Pittsburg, Texas/Pittsburg

- Averaged 24.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 5.0 steals as a senior.
- Three-sport standout earning all-state honors in football, basketball, and track.
- Produced a quadruple-double his senior year en route to 2007 East Texas Player of the Year. A three-time All-East Texas team honoree from the Tyler Morning Telegram.

- Colorado's starting lineup in 2008-09 may consist of all freshmen and sophomores. It would be the school's youngest starting five since 1985-86, when four freshmen and one sophomore were starters for three consecutive games.
- Sophomore guard Cory Higgins is the Buffs' top returning scorer from a year ago. He averaged 9.7 points and 4.3 rebounds per game after starting all 32 contests.
- In 2007-08, Colorado improved in every shooting category - field goal, 3-point field goal and free throw percentages - from its effort two years ago. The Buffaloes also averaged 7.2 more rebounds per game and decreased their turnovers by 44 on the season.
- CU's win over Baylor in the 2008 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship marked the first time a No. 12 seed has defeated a No. 5 seed in the history of the event.
- The Buffaloes allowed just 64.4 points per game last season, their lowest average in 46 years. Colorado had 13.4 turnovers a game, the lowest mark in 28 seasons. Its 12.9 turnover average in Big 12 play was the lowest by a CU squad in the history of the conference.
- Senior forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson ranks eighth among returning Big 12 players in blocks. He had 26 rejections a year ago and also led the returning CU regulars by shooting 46.0 percent from the floor.
