- Sophomore forward Craig Brackins is the Cyclones' top returning scorer from last season after posting 11.4 points per game. He set an ISU freshman record with 33 points at Baylor a year ago.
- Brackins was just the third Cyclone freshman in school history to start every game. He recorded five 20-point outings and finished with 160 rebounds and 31 blocks.
- A former walk-on from Kirkwood Community College, senior Bryan Petersen will be another top returnee in 2008-09. He started all 32 games last year and averaged 5.9 points with a team-best 92 assists.
- For the first time in his three years at ISU, head coach Greg McDermott returns three guards in the backcourt who averaged 16.5 minutes or more a game - Petersen, Diante Garrett and Sean Haluska.
- ISU held its opponents to 41.6 percent shooting from the field last season, the fifth-lowest opponent clip since 1967.
- The Cyclones ranked among the top 100 nationally in fewest turnovers per game (13.2) and No. 25 in fewest fouls (16.1).

Dominique Buckley, G, 6-2, 205, Detroit, Mich./Romulus

- Averaged 15.2 points, 6.3 assists, 5.6 rebounds and 2.6 steals his senior year.
- A member of the *Detroit Free Press* Dream Team and an AP first-team all-state selection.

Wes Eikmeier, G, 6-3, 170, Fremont, Neb./ Archbishop Bergan

- Scored 2,193 points in his high school career, ranking eighth all-time in Nebraska prep history. Averaged 31.1 points, 3.7 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 3.1 assists, leading his team to a 27-0 record and Class D-I state title as a senior.
- Two-time Gatorade Nebraska Player of the Year and Super State pick by the *Omaha World-Herald* (2007 & 2008).

Justin Hamilton, C, 6-11, 255, Alpine, Utah/Lone Peak

- As a senior, he averaged 10.1 points, 6.9 rebounds and 3.2 blocks and played an intrical role in leading his team to a Class 5A state title.
- Voted Utah's Most Improved Player in 2007-08 and earned first-team all-state honors after setting a single-season school record of 77 blocks, 10 of which came in the state championship game.

Clinton Mann, F, 6-7, 230, Overland Park, Kan./St. Thomas Aquinas

- Averaged 18.6 points and 9.4 rebounds and shot 52 percent from the field his senior year.
- First-team Class 5A all-state by the *Wichita Eagle* and Kansas Basketball Coaches Association and first-team all-class selection.

L.A. Pomlee, F, 6-8, 235, Davenport, Iowa/Central

- Ranked as the 38th-best power forward in the class of 2008 by Scout.com after averaging 15.4 points and leading the Mississippi Athletic Conference in both rebounding (10.1 rpg) and field goal percentage (63.8 percent).
- Was a first-team Class 4A all-state selection by both the Iowa Newspaper Association and *Des Moines Register*, and was picked to the *Quad City Times* All-Metro Team.

Jamie Vanderbeken, F, 6-11, 245, Belleville, Ontario/Quinte/Tyer JC [Texas]

- Led Tyler to a top 10 national ranking and its first outright conference title in 21 years by averaging 14.1 points and 9.1 rebounds, en route to being invited to play in the NJCAA All-Star game.
- Led the team in field goal percentage (56.7 percent) and was second in 3-pointers made with 40, earning him second-team All-Region XIV honors.

- The Jayhawks won their fifth national championship in 2007-08, the first NCAA title for the Big 12 and KU's first since 1988. The team finished with a school-record 37 victories and a 13-game winning streak.
- Bill Self is the winningest head coach in Division I over the past five seasons with an .816 winning percentage. The KU mentor has averaged 28.4 victories during his five years in Lawrence.
- KU has won the postseason Big 12 Championship six times, more than any other league school. The Jayhawks have won nine straight postseason Big 12 games and boast a 25-6 all-time championship record.
- In its history, Kansas has won 30 games or more in eight different seasons. Six of those 30-win campaigns have come since the 1997 season.
- Junior guard Sherron Collins earned the Big 12 Sixth Man Award in 2007-08. He scored in double-digits 15 times, including both games at the Final Four. He was also perfect from the free throw line in 12 outings a season ago.
- The Jayhawks had five players selected in the 2008 NBA Draft. Brandon Rush and Darrell Arthur were first-round selections, while Mario Chalmers, Darnell Jackson and Sasha Kaun went in the second round. The five players chosen ties the two-round NBA Draft record.
