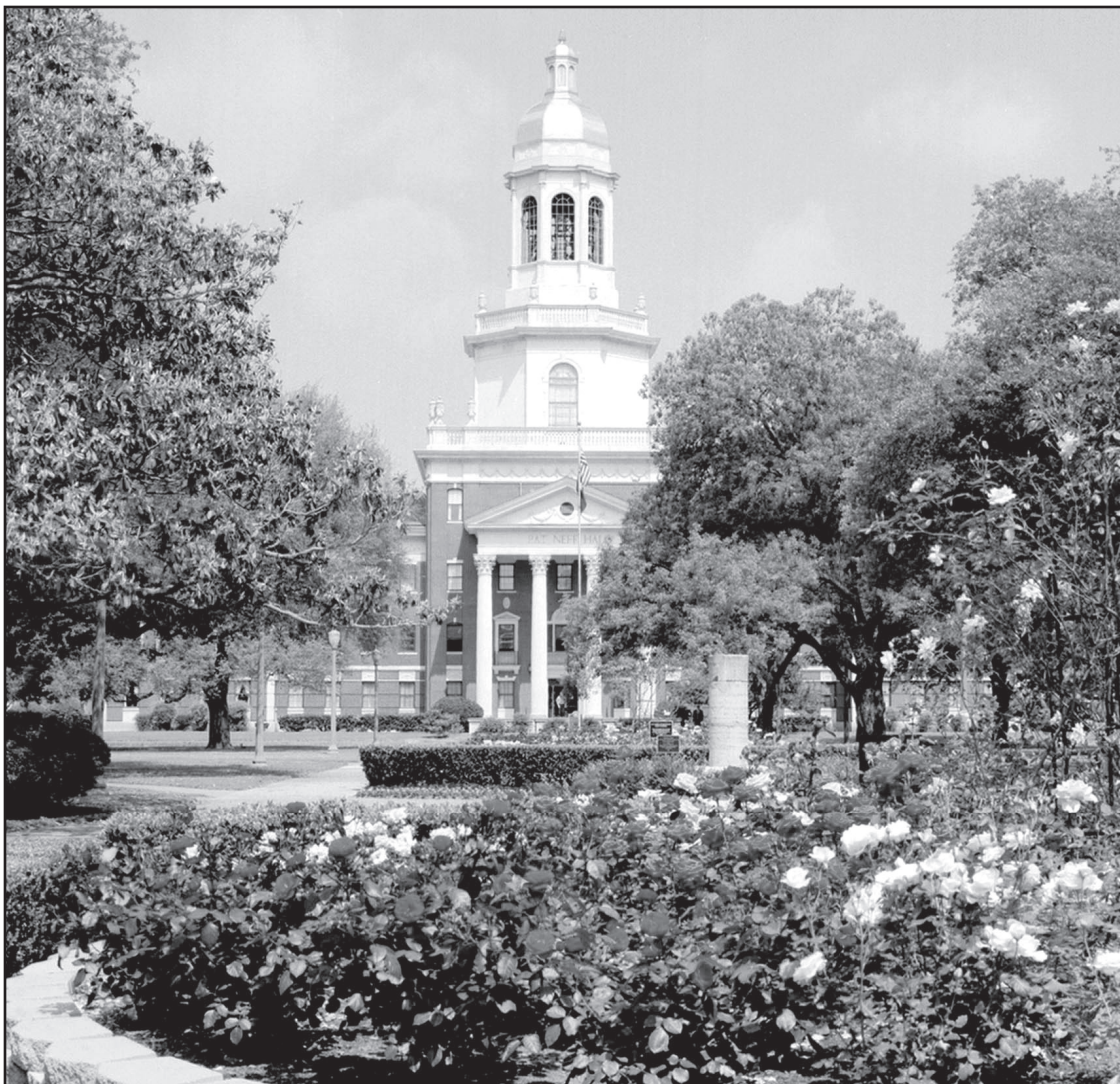

Coaching Highlights:

- ⇒ Led Baylor to the Big 12's first basketball national title (men's or women's) in 2005 with a 33-3 mark
- ⇒ Became the first person in women's basketball history to win a national championship as both a player (Louisiana Tech) and head coach, and only the third person to accomplish this feat in both men's and women's basketball
- ⇒ Captured the '2005 Big 12 regular season and championship titles en route to her first Big 12 Coach of the Year honor
- ⇒ Led the Lady Bears to eight postseason trips, including all seven of the school's NCAA Tournament appearances
- ⇒ Has played or coached in the national championship game on seven occasions
- ⇒ A member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, CoSIDA Academic All-America Hall of Fame, National High School Hall of Fame, Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame, and Louisiana Tech Athletics Hall of Fame.

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Baylor Lady Bears

The Lady Bears return 63.6 percent of their scoring, 80.5 percent of rebounding and 80.7 percent of blocked shots from the 2007-08 season.

With the addition of assistant coach Leon Barmore (Class of 2003), Baylor has two Women's Basketball Hall of Famers on its staff (Kim Mulkey, Class of 2000).

Eight letterwinners, including four starters (Allison, Morrow, Player, Wilson) return off of last season's NCAA Tournament team.

This season's 13-player roster also includes seven newcomers with five freshmen and two transfers.

BU lost last year's leading scorer, Angela Tisdale, to graduation, but returns its next five top scorers, led by Rachel Allison's 13.1 ppg. Allison topped the squad in rebounding a season ago with 8.5 per outing.

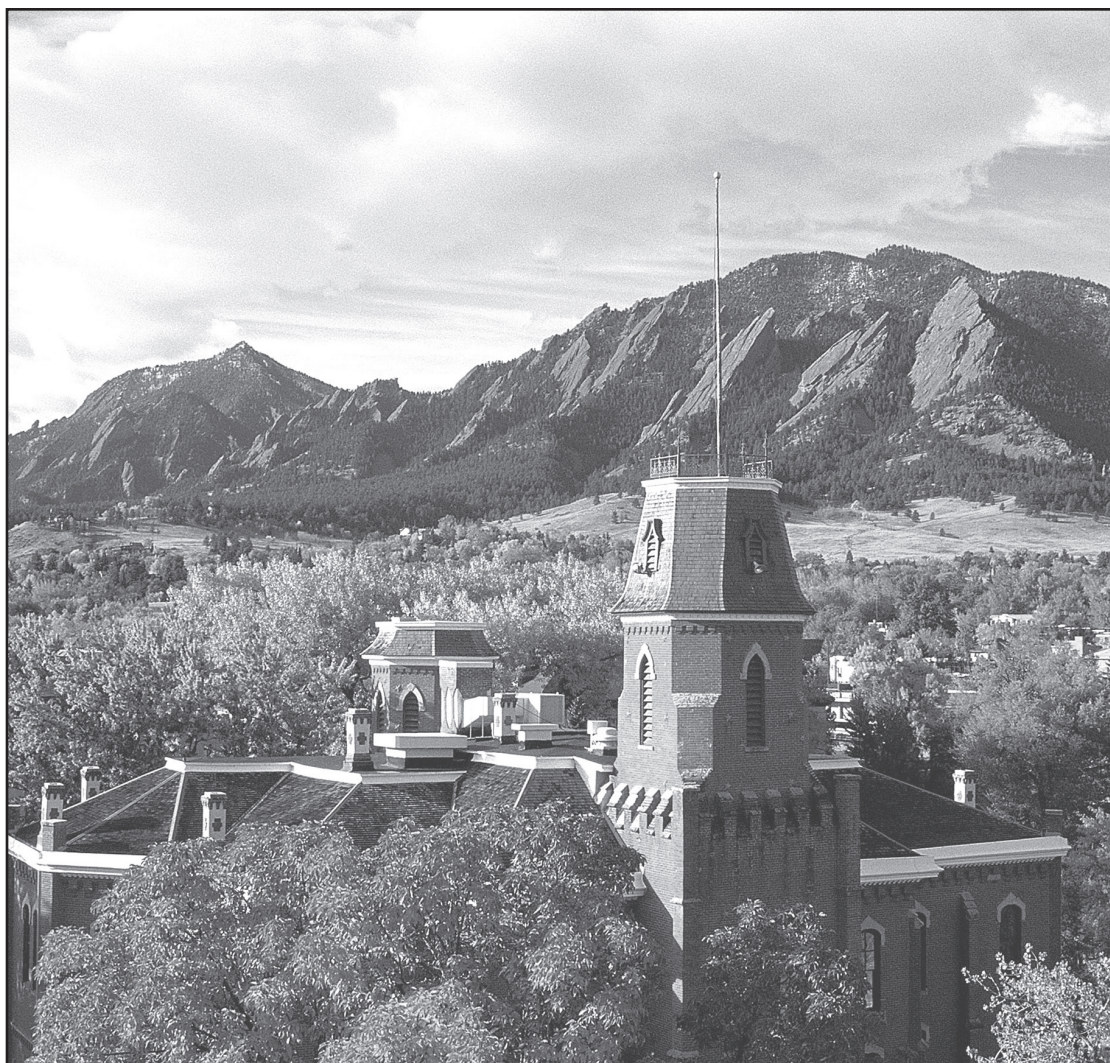

Colorado welcomes back nine letterwinners, including two starters from last year's squad.

The Buffs lost leading scorer and rebounder Jackie McFarland to graduation, but return second-leading scorer Brittany Spears who started all 34 games and averaged 13.9 ppg and 7.6 rpg as a freshman.

Spears is the first player in CU history with 50 assists, 50 steals and 50 blocks in a season. She led all Big 12 freshmen in scoring, rebounding and blocked shots in 2007-08.

Spears is a returning All-Big 12 honorable mention selection and was a member of the 2008 Big 12 All-Rookie Team.

Guard Bianca Smith set CU single-season records a year ago with 80 three-point field goals on 217 attempts.

Last season Colorado received its first AP national ranking, peaking at No. 23, and first postseason appearance since 2003-04.

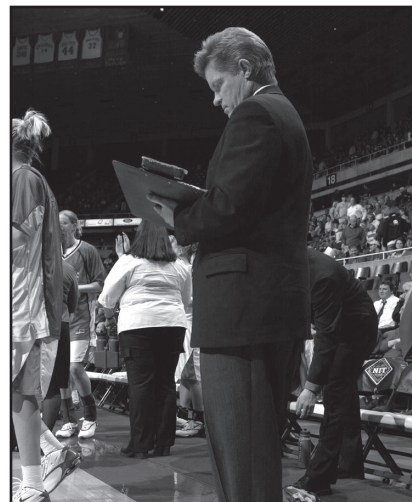

Iowa State Cyclones

Iowa State advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season, its 11th postseason appearance under coach Bill Fennelly.

The Cyclones have a league-leading 20 wins in Big 12 Championship games after going 2-1 in last year's event.

ISU returns its entire starting lineup in 2008-09, plus two other starters (Nicky Wieben, Toccara Ross) who went down with injury during last season. In addition the squad will add four newcomers to the mix.

Point guard Alison Lacey was the team's leader in both scoring (14.2 ppg) and assists (4.3) last year.

With a 21-13 record in 2007-08, Iowa State reached the 20-win plateau for the ninth time in school history and the eighth occasion under Fennelly.

Fennelly served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal winning 2008 USA U18 National Team.
