- This marks the second meeting between the two teams in the Big 12 Championship. Missouri won the first meeting 5-4 in 11 innings exactly nine years ago to the day.
- This was the first time a game has gone into extra innings in the Big 12 Baseball Championship since Baylor defeated Kansas 2-1 in 2005.

No. 4 Missouri - 3

- Overall record: 38-17
- Missouri is now 14-16 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- MU is now 3-1 versus Texas this season
- The win extends the Tigers' win streak to five.
- The 31 runs Missouri scored against Texas on April 11 was the most in a game all season.
- Jacob Priday hit his 16th homerun and fifth against the Longhorns this year while totaling his fourth in Big 12 Championship play.
- The Tigers are now 11-7 against Top 25 teams in 2008.
- The win puts Mizzou at 2-2 in extra innings this season.

No. 5 Texas - 2

- Overall record: 34-20
- Texas is now 20-14 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- The 'Horns are 5-5 on the first day of Big 12 Championship play.
- Starting pitcher Chance Ruffin struck out 10 Tiger batters, his second highest total of the season (11 vs. BU on 05/02/08)
- When leading after five innings, UT drops to 31-5.
- The 14 batters fanned are the most by Longhorn pitchers on the year.
- The Longhorns are now 6-10 versus ranked teams this season.
- The loss puts UT at 2-2 in extra innings this season.
- The loss snaps the team's six-game win streak, tied for their longest in 2008.
