Miscellaneous

- This is the first time the two teams have met in Big 12 postseason play.
- Oklahoma State leads the all-time series over Kansas State, 148-50. However, the Wildcats took the regular season series two games to one.
- The higher-seeded team won only one game today. (No. 4 Missouri defeated No. 5 Texas)
- With Kansas State's win, it marked only the second time in Big 12 Championship history that the top three seeds have lost on the first day. (2004)

No. 2 Oklahoma State - 2

- Overall record: 40-16
- The Cowboys are one of only three teams to appear in the conference postseason each of the 12 years. (Oklahoma and Baylor)
- OSU is 10-23 all-time and has lost nine in row at the Big 12 Championship.
- Rafael Thomas' third extra base hit of the season came in the bottom of the eighth inning and was the Cowboys' first extra base hit of the game.
- Oklahoma State falls to 29-3 when they hold their opponents to three or fewer runs.
- The Cowboys are now 8-2 in one run games.

No. 7 Kansas State - 3

- Overall record: 28-27
- The Wildcats improved to 9-12 against ranked opponents in 2008.
- KSU is 5-3 at the Big 12 Championship all-time.
- Nate Tenbrink took the team lead with nine homers when he hit a two-run shot in the first inning.
- Brad Hutt recorded a season-high six strikeouts. (Previous high was five)
- With the win tonight, the Wildcats won their first opening day game ever at the Big 12 Championship.
