- With the win today and after sweeping A&M last weekend, the Longhorns own a 17-3 record versus the Aggies since the 2003 Big 12 Championship.
- This marks the ninth time the two squads have met in the Big 12 Championship. The nine meetings are tied for the most match-ups between two squads in postseason conference play.
- The higher seed has won only one game in the championship thus far.
- The 15 runs are the most UT has scored against TAMU since April 30, 1999. (18)

No. 5 Texas – 15

- Overall record: 35-20
- Texas is now 21-14 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- Texas has never appeared as the No. 5 seed in the Big 12 Championship.
- The Longhorns are now 7-10 versus ranked teams this season.
- Kyle Russell hit his first triple of the year in the first inning.
- The 15 runs scored by UT in today's game are the most by a single team in the Big 12 postseason thus far.
- The Longhorns have hit multiple triples in a game four times this season, including two times against the Aggies.

No. 1 Texas A&M - 9

- Overall record: 42-16
- The Aggies are 15-18 all-time at the Big 12 Championship and 3-6 versus the 'Horns.
- The loss marks their eighth-straight defeat, their longest such streak of their season.
- Texas A&M is now 5-4 versus ranked teams this season.
- With a record 5-6, A&M has a losing record in the Big 12 Championship as a No. 1 seed and are now 0-2 versus the No. 5 seed.
- Starting pitcher Brooks Raley gave up a season high 10 runs. His previous high was five.
- This is the most runs the Aggies have given up all season.
