**Miscellaneous**

- This marks the seventh time the two squads have met in the Big 12 Championship. The Cowboys hold a 4-3 edge over the Bears.
- Baylor beat Oklahoma State 3-1 on the first day in last year's Big 12 Championship.
- OSU owns a 34-25 advantage over BU with the teams going 2-2 head-to-head in 2008.
- Until today's games, the higher seed had won only one game in the championship. Oklahoma State improved the higher-seeded teams to 3-5 on the week.
- OSU and BU are two of only three teams to appear in the Big 12 postseason each of the 12 years (OU).

**No. 2 Oklahoma State - 14**

- Overall record: 41-16
- OSU is 11-23 all-time and snapped a nine-game losing streak at the Big 12 Championship.
- Thomas Belza, going 2-for-4, extended his season-high hit streak to nine games, totaling 18 hits in that span.
- Rebel Ridling took the league lead in homeruns with his 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> shots of the year. He hit the fifth grand slam in championship history giving him six RBI in this game and 19 in the last eight games. The six RBI are a season high and one away from his career high.
- Andrew Oliver gave up a season-high nine hits while also recording a season-high 11 strikeouts.

**No. 6 Baylor - 3**

- Overall record: 32-25
- Baylor is now 21-19 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- The Bears fell to 5-13 against ranked opponents in 2008.
- Starting pitcher Craig Fritsch gave up a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits.
- With the loss Baylor falls to 3-8 in Friday games. They have at least a .500 record in games played on every other day of the week
- The four hits recorded by Donnie Webb ties his season high.
