

Miscellaneous

- This marks the fifth time the two squads have met in the Big 12 Championship. The Longhorns own a 4-1 advantage over the Sooners, having won the last four meetings.
- Texas leads the all-time series 128-50-2, having won the regular-season series the last 10 years, including a 2-1 regular-season record in 2008.
- The lower-seeded teams hold a 5-4 edge thus far in the championship.
- The bottom seed has never advanced to the championship game.
- The 7,190 attendance is the most recorded so far in the 2008 championship.

No. 5 Texas - 11

- Overall record: 36-20
- Texas is now 22-14 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- With the win, Texas now awaits the result of Missouri vs. Texas A&M. If Missouri loses, Texas would advance to the championship game tomorrow for the first time since 2003. (defeated Baylor 10-8 in 10 innings)
- Travis Tucker hit his first homerun of the year in the bottom of the fifth inning.
- Starting pitcher Kenn Kasperek tied his season-high three walks.
- The Longhorns have had a double in nine straight games, totaling 24 in that span.
- Texas had five different players hit doubles in the game for the first time this season.

No. 8 Oklahoma - 10

- Overall record: 34-24-1
- Oklahoma is now 21-20 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- OU is 9-15-1 against top 25 teams in 2008.
- The Sooners scored six runs in the seventh inning, more than the total from each of their first two games. (four runs apiece)
- Jarod Freeman hit a three-run triple in the seventh inning, his first of the season.
- The Sooners have recorded a double play in eight straight games, totaling 14 in that span.
- Oklahoma was eliminated with the loss.
