Miscellaneous

- This marks the second time the two squads have met in the Big 12 Championship. The Wildcats won the last matchup 6-2 in 2002. That year KSU was the No. 6 seed and BU was the No. 7 seed.
- Baylor owns a 29-11 advantage over Kansas State, with both teams going 2-2 on the season.
- For the third straight night cap, ducks made an appearance on the field.
- The Big 12 Championship game between KSU and UT will be played at 1:00 p.m. tomorrow.

No. 6 Baylor - 2

- Overall record: 32-26
- Baylor is now 21-20 all-time at the Big 12 Championship.
- The only Bear loss to the Wildcats this year was recorded by today's starting pitcher, Kendal Volz.
- Kendal Volz recorded his first win since his three-game streak that started the 2008 season.
- Junior first baseman Adam Horung, who went 2-for-4 on the night, is the only Bear to start every game this season.
- This is the ninth one-run game the Bears have played in the Big 12 Championship, with 3-6 record in those games.

No. 7 Kansas State - 3

- Overall record: 29-28
- KSU is 6-4 at the Big 12 Championship all-time.
- Kansas State is the first No. 7 seed to reach the championship game since Missouri in 2004.
- Starting pitcher Justin Murray has given up a double in 10 of the 13 games he has started.
- The Wildcats are 7-23 when getting out-hit by an opponent.
- Kansas State has recorded a stolen base in nine consecutive games, totaling 18 in that span. The Wildcats lead the league with 105 total bases stolen.
- Daniel Edwards picked up a school record 12th save on the season.
- With the win, Kansas State makes its first appearance in the Big 12 Championship game. Of the current 10 Big 12 baseball teams, KSU is the only team to have never played in the championship final. They win the head to head tie breaker with Oklahoma State, having beaten them on the first day of play 3-2.
