



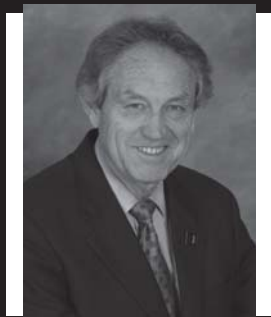

- Oklahoma State has the best record in the Big 12 over the last two seasons. The Cowboys are 57-11 overall and 24-8 in league play, both first in the conference.
- Sophomore **JamesOn Curry** scored in double-figures seven straight contests to end the 2004-05 season. Overall he posted 10 points or more 16 times. He is OSU's top returning scorer (9.4 ppg).
- Oklahoma State's 57 wins over the past two seasons are the third-most of any team in the nation. Only Illinois (63) and Duke (58) can boast more wins during that span.
- **Curry** scored 79 points in six postseason (Big 12 & NCAA) games last season. He averaged 13.2 points with 26 rebounds and 30 assists.
- The Cowboys ranked in the top six nationally in all three major shooting categories last season. OSU was first in 3-point field goal percentage (.426), second in free throw percentage (.780) and sixth in field goal percentage (.497).
- Head coach **Eddie Sutton** ranks sixth on the NCAA all-time victory list (781). He needs five wins to tie Lefty Driesell of Georgia State for fifth.

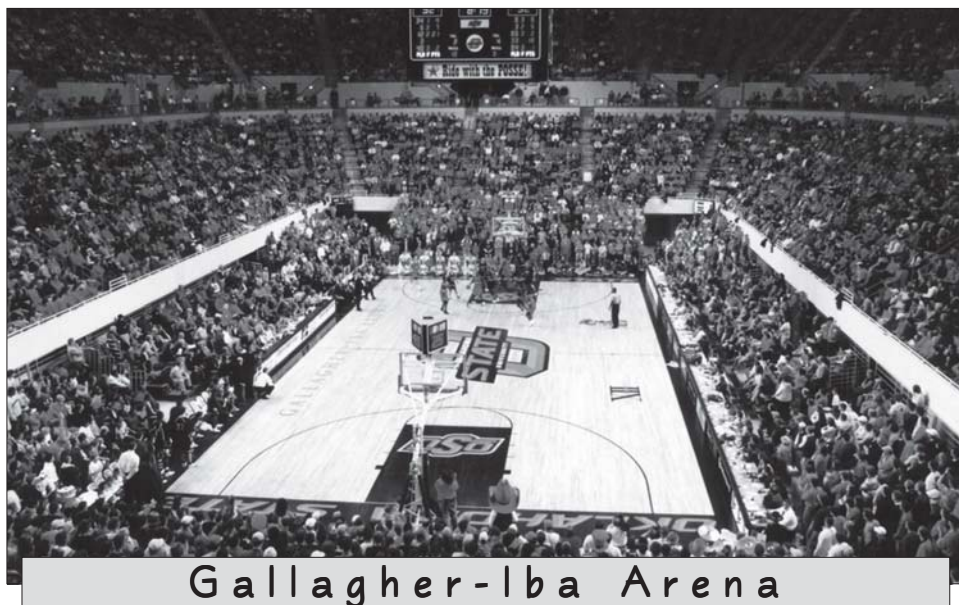

- Sophomore guard **Daniel Gibson** was named 2004-05 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, the second Longhorn in four seasons (T.J. Ford, 2002) to be recognized.
- **Gibson** led UT in scoring 13 times last season, posting double-digits on 24 occasions en route to a team-best 14.2 points per game. He became the first freshman ever to lead the team in scoring.
- UT welcomes back its top three scorers from last season. In addition to Gibson, junior **P.J. Tucker** (13.7) and senior **Brad Buckman** (12.5) are expected to suit up again in 2005-06.
- Texas was one of two schools in the nation (Utah) in 2004-05 to win a BCS bowl game and send both its men's and women's basketball teams to NCAA play.
- The Longhorns have made seven straight NCAA appearances and are one of seven schools nationally (Arizona, Duke, Indiana, Kansas, North Carolina, UCLA) to appear in 15 of the last 17 tournaments.
- UT has been ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 a total of 80 weeks under **Rick Barnes**. Prior to his arrival, the Longhorns had been nationally-ranked for 50 weeks in their history (1906-98).

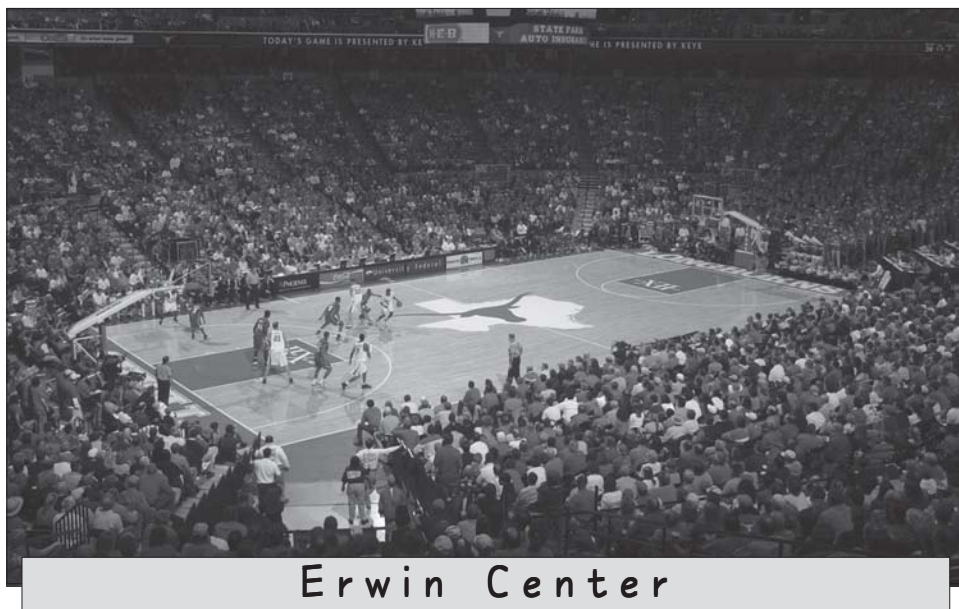
