Outlook

Five scholarship student-athletes and returning starter Tommy Swanson (6-9 center) form the nucleus of coach Scott Drew's second Baylor hoops' team as the Bears try to step up the rebuilding process.

BU hopes to play a little more up-tempo style as a 17-game home schedule bodes well for a squad composed of five freshmen, four sophomores, two juniors, and lone senior Ryan Pryor, who played in 20 contests last season.

Drew expects help from 7-0 freshman center Mamadou Diene (expected to begin play for the Bears during second semester) and six other signees. Transfers with some collegiate experience include junior guard Kevis Shipman and soph guards Roscoe Biggers and Patrick Fields.

Returnees Swanson (6.4 points per game, 4.1 rebounds per game), Pryor, and Turner Phipps combined for 7.4 ppg last season and have to step up all areas of their games immediately for Baylor to continue to advance in the rugged Big 12 race. Transfer Fields comes to Waco after averaging 17.6 points per tilt and eight rebounds each game as a freshman in 2003-04 at Panola (Miss.) College.

The team began stacking some building blocks with a sweep of Texas A&M in 2004 Big 12 activity and a regional television win over NIT-bound Iowa State 63-59. Drew piloted the 2003-04 squad to three wins in its first five games and the stage is set for some early success and momentum in 2004-05.

- His first Baylor squad exceeded all expectations by winning eight games, including three Big 12 contests, while playing with half the allotted scholarship players and a handful of walkons.
- Guided Valparaiso to the Mid-Continent regular season championship in 2002-03 with a 12-2 conference record.
- Prior to 2002-03 served as an assistant coach at Valparaiso under his father Homer Drew.
- Responsible for three Top 20 recruiting classes at Valpo in the last five years.
- As an assistant, Valparaiso made five consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances from 1996 to 2000. That included the 1998 tourney where Valpo advanced to the Sweet 16.
- Coached his father's 200th career victory in 2001 when Homer Drew was ill.
- Had two stints with Athletes in Action as an assistant coach in 1995 and head coach in 1997.
- Was named Baylor's 17th men's basketball coach on August 22, 2003.

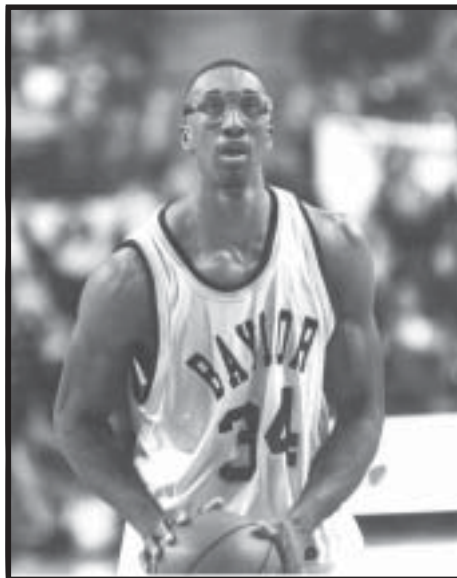

Outlook

2004 postseason NIT invitee Colorado has the opportunity to make its fifth trek to either NCAA or NIT activity over the last seven years, and the initial road may lead through New York again.

Coach Ricardo Patton's squad opens the season against College of Charleston in the 2004 Preseason NIT on Nov. 15 and takes on the Michigan-Binghamton winner if the Buffaloes can take their lidlifter in Boulder.

CU remained a force in the 2003-04 Big 12 race with a final record of 10-6 and fourth spot in the league before falling to Oregon of the Pacific-10 Conference in the '04 Postseason NIT first round. A challenging schedule awaits the current Buffs' edition, which has to replace over 71 percent of its '03-04 scoring and rebounding.

Starting guard Jayson Obazuaye brings back 5.5 points per game and hopes to get immediate help from transfer 5-11 point guard Michael Lasme, who averaged 7.5 ppg and 2.6 assists per game for Massachusetts two years ago. Former Loyola Marymount forward, 6-9 Andy Osborn, pitches in with a 9.9 scoring average and 3.8 rebounds for LMU in 2002-03. Forward Glean Eddy and point Marcus Hall contributed 291 points between them while playing in all 29 games for last season's CU entry and have high-scoring capabilities.

Patton's 10th edition in Boulder definitely will be one of his youngest, but the talent level and outside shooting potential excite the veteran coach. Toughest to replace from the 2003-04 edition are All-Big 12 center David Harrison (17.1 ppg, 8.8 rpg) and wing Michel Morandais (16.1 ppg).

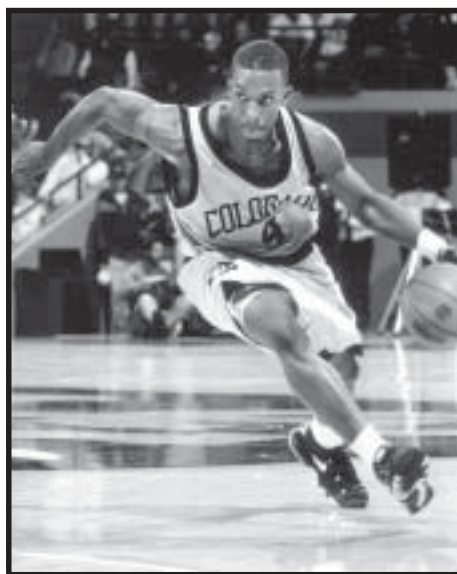
