Outlook

After winning its most overall clashes (14) and Big 12 games (six) since the 2001-02 season, coach Jim Wooldridge's Wildcats were just a few field goals away from a postseason jaunt in 2003-04.

With the addition of transfer 6-4 guard Fred Peete of Northeastern Oklahoma A&M JC, 6-4 freshman guard Clint Allen of Long Beach, Calif., and 6-4 guard Clint Stewart of Broken Arrow, Okla., the 'Cats have added some outside shooting to a squad blessed with five returning standouts who stand at least 6-8.

K-State also has proven to be tougher to defeat at home in recent seasons as the 2003-04 edition went 12-4 overall (4-4 in Big 12 play at Bramlage Coliseum). KSU has won 29 of its last 39 contests at the home confines.

Leading the charge for continued improvement this season are 6-7 forward and '04 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Jeremiah Massey (14.7 ppg), 6-7 forward Marques Hayden (8.0 ppg, 6.5 rpg), 6-8 key reserve forward Cartier Martin (6.9 ppg), and 6-10 forward Justin Williams (4.0 ppg) among seven letterwinners back on the roster.

Wooldridge, who has won 280 games in 17 previous seasons, did one of his top coaching jobs in the last campaign as K-State was haunted by injuries. Unsung heroes such as 6-11 forward Tyler Hughes, who scored six points and grabbed three boards in a key reserve role in KSU's 58-48 late-season upset over Texas, could make a difference in 2004-05.

Players to Watch

Jeremiah Massey, F, Senior



*Was named the Associated Press and *Dallas Morning News*' Big 12 Newcomer of the Year while he was selected to the coaches' third team All-Big 12 team as well as the Associated Press' honorable mention all-league team.

*Led the team in nine categories, including scoring (14.7 ppg.), 20-point games (10), double-doubles (eight), rebounding (7.8 rpg.), steals (1.0 spg.) and blocks (0.6 bpg.).

*Was twice named the Big 12 Rookie of the Week (Feb. 9 and March 8).

*Not since Jean Derouillere averaged 15.7 points in 1989-90 had a first-year player averaged more than Massey.

Marques Hayden, F, Junior



*Averaged 8.0 points and 6.5 rebounds in 28 games last season, including 26 starts.

*Led the team and ranked seventh in the Big 12 with a 53.4 field goal percentage.

*Placed 12th in the league in double-doubles (five) and 13th in rebounding.

Cartier Martin, F, Sophomore



*Averaged 6.9 points and 3.0 rebounds in 20 appearances last season, including three starts.

*Struggled with injuries most of the 2003-04 season, missing five

games in January.

*Scored in double digits in five contests, including a season-high 19 points against Saint Louis on Jan. 3.

Noting Wooldridge

- Went 12-4 in home games last year, including an upset of No. 10 Texas in the final regular season game.
- Landed the top-ranked recruiting class entering 2003-04 by Hoop Scoop magazine.
- In 2002-03 K-State defeated five teams that advanced to postseason.
- Guided the Wildcats to an improvement in the win column in each of his first three seasons at K-State. His first Wildcat squad defeated two Top 25 teams and in 2001-02 K-State defeated No. 9 Oklahoma State and NCAA Sweet 16 team Texas.
- K-State has advanced to the quarterfinals of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Tournament in two of the four seasons under Wooldridge.
- Led Southwest Texas to its first NCAA Tournament appearance ever in 1994 when the Bobcats went 25-7.
- Went 14-13 in his first season in 1994-95 at Louisiana Tech marking the second-best turnaround in nation that season. La Tech was 2-25 the previous season.
- Guided Central Missouri to three appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament.
- Was an assistant coach on the Central Missouri NCAA Division II national championship team in 1984.
- Joined former roommate at Louisiana Tech Tim Floyd as an assistant with the Chicago Bulls from 1998-2000.
- As a player at Louisiana Tech Wooldridge earned his team's best defensive player award two straight seasons.

Outlook

Competing in the new 15,000-capacity Paige Sports Arena, the Tigers compete for their 19th postseason berth in the last 21 years in 2004-05.

While administrators have brought the famed Norm Stewart Court down the hill from the 32-season home of Missouri basketball—the Hearnes Center, there will be several nuances for the coming campaign.

Head coach Quin Snyder seeks his 101st career victory in the team's regular-season opener against Brown in the Guardians Classic at Columbia after averaging 20 wins per season at 100-63 from 1999-2004 with the Tigers. The school has added several intersectional encounters to an always-rugged non-conference schedule. MU hosts traditional powers Arkansas, Indiana, Gonzaga, UNLV, and American at the Paige Sports Arena while trekking to St. Louis for the annual bout with Illinois.

Keys to the success against these tough foes and the 16-game Big 12 round-robin are Big 12 All-Reserve Team guard Jason Conley, 6-8 Freshman All-America Linas Kleiza, 30-game starting guard Jimmy McKinney, and late-blooming 6-5 soph guard Thomas Gardner. Junior transfer guard Marcus Watkins arrives at Mizzou with new MU associate head coach Melvin Watkins from the Texas A&M program while 6-0 freshman Jason Horton looks to provide immediate depth at the point guard position.

Missouri continues to be one of the Big 12's top transition teams after averaging 74.2 points per game (fifth in the Big 12) and pulling down 37.8 rebounds each outing.

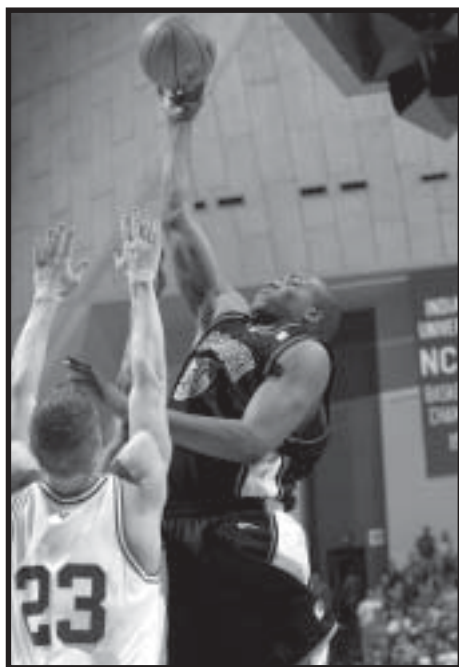
