Outlook

Coming off its best season—18-13—since the 1999 Huskers closed 20-13 and also advanced to the NIT, Nebraska achieved a seven-win turnaround from 11-19 in 2002-03 to the 18 victories prior to the current close.

A high-scoring and successful tour of Australia last summer produced some valuable experience for NU and renewed optimism after last year's postseason sojourn, which was ended by a one-point loss at Hawai'i.

All-Big 12 candidate John Turek at 6-9, 245 pounds, covers a lot of ground in the middle of the Huskers' offense and defense while averaging just under 10 ppg (9.8) as a junior. Shooting guard Jake Muhleisen remains one of the Big 12's most accurate three-point shot makers after hitting just under 36 percent (27-for-66) in 2003-04. The "tres" remains a big part of the Huskers' attack as the team was third in the Big 12 with 6.8 three-pointers per contest.

Five solid newcomers, including 6-11 center Aleks Maric and 6-2 guard Marcus
Perry, among others, hope to offset the loss of double-figure scorers guard Nate Johnson (13.0 ppg) and forward Andrew Drevo (10.8 ppg).



Head coach Barry Collier expects another scrappy defensive team, which topped its opponents by four rebounds per game last season, and another shot at postseason play within the challenging scenario of Big 12 play and non-league foes such as Minnesota, Tennessee, Creighton, Marquette and UAB.

Noting Collier

- Was named to the NABC Board of Directors in June 2002.
- Guided Nebraska to the NIT second round in 2003-04 and 18 wins, its most since the 1999 season.
- Led NU to a 70-26 victory over Bethune-Cookman in 2004, a Big 12 record low for points allowed (26) and points allowed in a half (12).
- Collier helped Nebraska rank third nationally in three-pointers made per game in 2001-02, as the Huskers hit a school-record 267 treys.
- In his first year, Collier guided Nebraska to three more overall and three more conference wins than the previous season.
- Helped Nebraska to rank among top 20 in the nation in team field-goal percentage in 2000-01.
- Led Butler to the postseason six times in his 11 seasons includ-

ing his final four years (three NCAA, three NIT).

- Butler posted five 20-win seasons under Collier in each of the past four years.
- Took Butler to three NCAA Tournament appearances (1997, 1998, 2000) and posted nine winning seasons.



Coach Kelvin Sampson's squads always use in-your-face defense and unselfish team play on offense, and that formula has produced seven consecutive 20-win seasons, an average of 23 victories each campaign, nine NCAA appearances in the last 10 years, and 23 consecutive postseason appearances since 1982—10 in a row under Sampson's watch.

If wing-footed 5-7 guard Drew Lavender (11.3 ppg, 3.9 apg), 6-2 guard Lawrence McKenzie (8.2 ppg) and recuperated 6-8 forward Kevin Bookout (7.6 ppg, 5.5 rpg, before he underwent shoulder surgery and missed the final 17 games of the season) play up to expectation levels, the 2004-05 squad should be in Big 12 contention for the duration.

Three newcomers who averaged better than 10 rebounds per outing in their previous assignments expand OU's inside horizons immediately. 6-10 Longar Longar added 11.8 rpg to his 15.4 ppg. Freshman guard David Godbold pulled down 11.3 rpg

at Oklahoma City's Douglass HS to accompany a 24 ppg scoring norm while 6-8 forward Taj Gray grabbed 10.8 rpg at Redlands (Okla.) CC as a sophomore.

Better free throw shooting, replacing leading scorer Jason Detrick (11.4 ppg) and the development of four returning lettermen to blend with the incoming talent are chief goals for Oklahoma.
