Outlook

New coach Billy Gillispie adds a seasoned element in Texas collegiate basketball experience and recruiting the talent-fertile state as he takes over the Aggies' program in 2004-05.

Gillispie accomplished one of the biggest turnarounds nationally last winter when he guided the UTEP Miners to a 24-8 record and NCAA appearance after the 2002-03 squad finished 6-24. That 18-game improvement was the best in NCAA Division I men's hoops.

An upcoming edition with one senior—6-0 guard Bobby Leach—poses a new challenge for the first-year Texas A&M mentor, but he did make some inroads with late recruiting. 6-9 center-forward Joseph Jones, 6-7 junior forward Edjuan Green from Temple (Texas) College and 6-9

freshman forward Slade Weishuhn can be immediate contributors.

They join Leach (3.5 ppg, 1.3 rpg) and returning starters 6-7 Antoine Wright (13.5 ppg) and Acie Law IV (7.5 ppg, team-most 104 assists) as the Ags seek to rebound from a 7-21 overall record and 0-16 mark in Big 12 games.

The 2003-04 Aggies had almost the same offensive output (71.9 team ppg) as the previous A&M squad (72.0 ppg) but have a goal of lessening the conference's highest-yielding defense at 76.4 ppg. More aggressive play and stouter defense are two points of emphasis in the new season.

Noting Gillispie

- First native Texan to coach the Aggies since the mid-1930s.
- Led UTEP to one of the most dramatic turnarounds in college

basketball history going from 6-24 his first season to 24-8 and an NCAA Tournament appearance in his second season.

- UTEP captured the 2004 Western Athletic Conference title, its first in 12 years, after being ninth in the preseason poll.
- The Miners became only the third WAC team in history, and the first in 35 years, to win the league title after finishing last the previous year.
- Served eight years as an assistant coach at Baylor, Tulsa and Illinois.
- Was part of a coaching unit that L recorded 85 wins over three years the second-highest total in the second-high
- years, the second-highest total in the nation in that period, and captured four consecutive conference titles -- two in the Big Ten and two in the WAC.
- Was a member of the only staff in NCAA history to coach different schools to the Elite Eight in successive seasons -- Tulsa in 2000 and Illinois in 2001.
- Is Texas A&M's 19th head coach for men's basketball.



Outlook

The Red Raiders of coach Bob Knight go after a fourth consecutive 20-win season after becoming the first trio of Tech teams to capture back-to-back-to-back 20-plus-victories' success.

Though leading scorer Andre Emmett (20.6 ppg, 6.6 rpg) has graduated, the team has a pair of shooting guards who can take up some of that slack. Jarrius Jackson (11.3 ppg) and Ronald Ross (10.1 ppg, 3.4 rpg, 108 assists) pace the fast break while seven other returning lettermen give the team its best depth in the four-year tenure of coach Knight.

6-8 power forward Devonne Giles started 25 games for the 2003-04 Red Raiders and contributed 8.9 ppg and five boards per outing. Key reserve 6-9 forward Darryl Dora was a solid role player with 3.3 ppg and 2.6 rpg in 14 minutes per contest.

While 6-9 forward Robert Tomaszek will be tough to replace as a two-year starter, but freshmen forwards Philip Harbaugh and Damir Suljagic (both 6-8) add height and size in the middle. The team returns 11 total letters earned (Ross has three), but the potential remains for a return to NCAA
