Other double figure scorers included Iowa State's Jamaal Tinsley (12.5 ppg), Baylor's Terry Black (10.2 ppg), and Kansas' Luke Axtell (10.7), who missed the final three games due to injury.

Oklahoma State forward Andre Williams paced the team in rebounding with a 5.7 average. Williams pulled down a tour-high 14 rebounds in the final game.

Tinsley led the team with 30 assists over the six games. The senior guard also led the all stars in steals with 18.

Four of the 12 players averaged double figures for the Big 12 All-Stars led by Iowa State's Jake Sullivan at 12.7 ppg. Other double figure scorers included Oklahoma State's Ivan McFarlin (12.3), Kansas State's Pervis Pasco (11.8), and Nebraska's Jake Muhleisen (10.3). Pasco led the team in rebounding with a seven rebound per game average. Pasco led the team in scoring twice and in rebounding three times.
