DIRECTIONS TO BIG 12 STADIUMS

BAYLOR - Directions to Floyd Casey Stadium

Floyd Casey Stadium is located just off Valley Mills Drive, between Dutton and Clay Streets.

<u>From the North</u> drive south on I-35, take Valley Mills Drive exit to west. Stadium is approximately one mile on right. Follow directions into stadium lots

<u>From the South</u> drive north on I-35, take Valley Mills Drive exit to west. Stadium is approximately one mile on right. Follow directions into stadium lots

<u>From the West</u> drive east on Hwy. 84 to Franklin/Waco Dr. split. Take Franklin to the right, go to 32nd street, turn right and go past Hart-Patterson Track & Field complex into stadium lots.

From the East take Hwy. 84 to I-35. Turn south on I-35 (left) and follow directions listed above.

COLORADO - Directions to Folsom Field

From Denver International Airport:

Toll Free Route - Take Pena Boulevard out of the airport grounds and follow to Interstate 70 West. Take I-70 West to Interstate 270 West (the only direction that can be taken). Stay on I-270; which will turn into U.S. 36 in about five miles. Take U.S. 36 all the way to Boulder (21 miles). Once in Boulder, U.S. 36 becomes 28th Street; the first light in town is Colorado Avenue; Make a left on Colorado and the next two intersections have lights (Regent Drive, Folsom Street). The stadium is on the corner of Colorado and Folsom. Estimated Drive Time: 50-55 minutes.

Toll Route - Take Pena Boulevard to E-470 North (Exit 6 still on airport property). Take E-470 all the way to U.S. 36; there will be three toll stops on this route. Along the way, E-470 will turn into the Northwest Parkway but it is in the same road. There will be two lights at the end of the highway before exiting west on U.S. 36; take U.S. 36 into Boulder (7 miles). Once in Boulder, U.S. 36 becomes 28th Street; the first light in town is Colorado

Avenue; make a left on Colorado and the next two intersections have lights (Regent Drive and Folsom Street). The stadium is on the corner of Colorado and Folsom. Estimated Drive Time: 40-45 minutes.

Note: U.S. 36 is also accessible from Interstate 25 (no tolls); Intersection of I-25 & U.S. 36 is where I-270 turns into U.S. 36.

From Des Moines International Airport:

IOWA STATE - Directions to Jack Trice Stadium

Proceed out of airport parking and turn left (North) on Fleur Drive. Drive North toward downtown Des Moines and travel approximately 3.5 miles before crossing the Raccoon River bridge. After crossing the bridge, take the first right-hand turn, traveling East on Locust Street. Proceed East through downtown until you reach Second Street. Turn left on Second Street (heading North) and work way into the far right-hand lane. Proceed up the hill and to entrance to the Des Moines Freeway (I-235). Take I-235 East and simply keep following that road out of Des Moines and the next 35 miles to Ames (I-235 turns into I-35 just outside the Des Moines city limits).

To exit I-35 into Ames, take the Ames exit, heading West on U.S. Highway 30. Travel West on U.S. Highway 30, bypassing the Dayton and Duff Avenue exits, and turn off on the third exit (Iowa State Center). You'll be traveling North on Elwood Drive, which will take you to the stadium.

KANSAS - Directions to Memorial Stadium

From the East (Kansas City International Airport)

Kansas City International Airport is 60 miles to the Northeast and is served by most national airline carriers. As you exit the airport, turn left onto I-29 North. Continue on I-29 for several miles to I-435 South. Continue on I-435 to the junction of I-70 at exit #202 (West Lawrence). Follow Iowa Street to 6th Street heading East, to Mississippi Street, turn right on Mississippi Street, leading to Memorial Stadium. Allow an hour and a half hour driving time from KCI to Lawrence.

From the West (Forbes Field)

Forbes Field is located in Topeka, Kansas, approximately 30 miles West of Lawrence. Travel on Highway 75 North to I-70 East to the West Lawrence Kansas Turnpike exit #202, which will lead to lowa Street. Follow lowa to 6th Street heading East, to Mississippi Street, turn right on Mississippi Street, leading to Memorial Stadium.

KANSAS STATE - Directions to KSU Stadium/Wagner Field

From the West (Manhattan Airport)

Take Kansas Highway 18 East into Manhattan. Exit at Kansas 113 (Seth Childs Road, heading North). Stay on Seth Childs Road until reaching the Kimball Avenue exit. Turn right onto Kimball and follow it one mile to College Ave. KSU Stadium is located on the corner of Kimball and College.

From the East (Kansas City) or West via I-70

Exit I-70 at Highway 177 (exit 313) and head North on 177 until reaching Manhattan. Turn left on Tuttle Creek Blvd. Head North on Tuttle Creek until reaching Kimball Ave. Turn left on Kimball and go two miles to College Ave. KSU Stadium will be on the left.

MISSOURI - Directions to Memorial Stadium/Faurot Field

Missouri is located approximately two hours West of the Lambert St. Louis International Airport, and 2.5 hours East of the Kansas City International Airport, along Interstate 70. The University is approximately 15 minutes North of Columbia Regional Airport along Highway 63.

From Kansas City:

- Take Interstate 70 East, travel approximately 150 miles
- Take exit 124 to Stadium Boulevard
- Go South (right) 3 miles

From St. Louis

- Take Interstate 70 West, go approximately 120 miles
- Take exit 128A, Highway 63 South (left)
- Take Highway 63 South for 1 mile
- Take the Stadium Boulevard Exit and travel West (right) for 1.5 miles

From Columbia Regional Airport

- Take Highway 63 North (right), go 15 miles
- Take the Stadium Boulevard exit, travel west (left) for 1.5 miles

NEBRASKA - Directions to Memorial Stadium

From Lincoln Memorial Airport:

Turn right on Northwest 12th Street as you drive out of the airport. Northwest 12th becomes Cornhusker Highway, which intersects with Interstate 180. Exit South (downtown) onto I-180, which turns into one-way, southbound, Ninth Street in downtown Lincoln. Drive two blocks and turn left at P Street (just past the Lincoln Journal Star Building), go one block and turn left on 10th Street, then keep to the right for four blocks to Memorial Stadium (DO NOT enter I-180 North).

From Omaha's Eppley Airfield:

Follow the signs from downtown Omaha and Interstate 480. Take I-480 west to Interstate 80, then take I-80 west approximately 60 miles to I-180. Exit South (downtown) on I-180 and follow the above directions.

Memorial Stadium is located on the east side of Stadium Drive, between T Street on the south and Holdrege on the North.

OKLAHOMA - Directions to Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium

Directions from Oklahoma City Airport:

Follow directions from terminal to Interstate 44. Travel West on I-44 (Lawton). Merge to I-240 East. Take exit 4A South on Interstate 35. Norman is 17 miles South of the airport. To reach the stadium once in Norman, take the Lindsey Street exit. Turn left at the top of the ramp onto Lindsey. Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is located approximately three miles east of I-35 on the corner of Asp and Lindsey.

Directions from Dallas/Fort Worth:

Travel north on Interstate 35 to Norman. To reach the stadium, take the Lindsey Street exit. Turn right (east) at the top of the ramp onto Lindsey. Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is located approximately three miles east of I-35 on the corner of Asp and Lindsey.

OKLAHOMA STATE - Directions to Boone Pickens Stadium

<u>From Tulsa:</u> Take 244 West to Cimarron Turnpike (Highway 64). Take turnpike to Stillwater (Perkins Road) exit. After exiting turnpike take either Perkins Road or Washington Ave south to Hall of Fame. Turn right on Hall of Fame. Stadium is on the left.

TEXAS - Directions to Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium at Joe Jamail Field

Exit Austin Bergstrom International Airport and take a left at the stop light onto I-71 West. Follow 71 West to I-35 and go North. Follow I-35 North to the Martin Luther King Blvd. exit and take a left on MLK. Turn right onto Red River Street and the first possible left onto Robert Dedman Drive. Game day media parking is on Dedman Drive.



TEXAS A&M - Directions to Kyle Field



3-2-5-a-12 -- Clock stops when ball carrier, fumble or backward pass goes out of bounds and starts on the referee's signal, except that in the last two minutes of each half, the clock starts on the snap.

6-2-1 -- Free kick out of bounds: Option to put ball in play 30 yards downfield

9-1-2-p - "Horse-collar" tackle introduced as a personal foul
9-1-2-q -- Five-yard face mask/helmet opening foul eliminated. Foul is only for twisting, turning or pulling the face mask or helmet opening—15 yards.
9-1-3 -- Initiating Contact/Crown of Helmet/Targeting an opponent
9-1-6 -- Sideline infractions (formerly warnings): First two—fouls for delay of game (5-yard penalty). Third and subsequent—foul for sideline interference (15-yard penalty).

penalty) **12-3-1** -- Reviewable play: Field goal attempt above or below crossbar and lower than top of uprights.

12-3-3 -- Reviewable play: Ball carrier ruled down and fumble immediately

12-3-3 -- Reviewable play: Ball carrier ruled down and rumble immediately recovered prior to dead-ball signal being given.

12-3-3 -- Reviewable play: Ball carrier ruled out of bounds and immediately carries ball into opponent's end zone prior to dead-ball signal being given.

12-3-3 -- Egregious game-clock error may be corrected by Instant Replay Official

(IRO).

12-3-4 -- Egregious errors may be corrected by the IRO. However, this does not include reviewing fouls that are not specifically reviewable.

1-4-9-d (FR-38)

Microphones, provided by home management, are strongly recommended on referees. [Note: Microphones for referees will be mandatory in 2010.] They may be used only on referees for penalty or other game announcements. It is strongly recommended that they be lapel-type microphones. They must be controlled by the referee, and may not be open at other times. Microphones on other officials are prohibited.

Any attempt to record, either through audio or video means, any signals given by an opposing player, coach, or other team personnel is prohibited.

2-3-3 (FR-42, 43)

A chop block is a high-low or low-high combination block by any two players against an opponent (not the runner) anywhere on the field, with or without a delay between contacts; the "low" component is at the opponent's thigh or below. 2-3-3-III and IV)

RULE 3 3-2-2-h (FR-65)

Delete paragraph (15-second clock)

Delete paragraph (Clock adjustment following inadvertent whistle)

b. 40-Second Clock. 1. When an official signals that the ball is dead, the play clock shall begin a 40-second count.

- Team A possession following a kick down.
- 8. Score.
- 9. Start of each period.
- Start of a team's series in extra period.
- Instant replay review.
 Other administrative stoppage.

When play is to be resumed, the referee will give the ready-for-play signal [S1] and the play clock will begin the 25-second count.
d. If a visual 40/25-second timing device becomes inoperative, both coaches shall be notified by the referee immediately and both clocks shall be turned off.

3-2-5-a-12 (FR-69)12. When a ball carrier, a fumble or a backward pass goes out of bounds.(Exception: Within the last two minutes of each half the clock starts on the snap

unless incidents 8 or 11 above occur.)

13. When the referee interrupts the 40/25-second count.

3-2-5-b and -c

b. If the clock was stopped for incidents other than those in 1 through 13 above it

shall be started on the snap. c. If incidents 1 through 13 occur in conjunction with any other situation that starts the clock on the snap, the clock will start on the snap

6-2-1-Penalty (FR-88) PENALTY—"..... ball in play 30 yards..."

RULE 9 9-1-2-p (FR-119)

All players are prohibited from grabbing the inside back collar of the shoulder pads or jersey, or the inside collar of the side of the shoulder pads or jersey, and immediately pulling the runner down. This does not apply to a runner who is inside the tackle box or to a quarterback who is in the pocket.

9-1-2-q (formerly s) (FR-119)

No player shall twist, turn or pull the face mask or any helmet opening of an opponent. It is not a foul if the face mask or helmet opening is not twisted, turned or pulled. When in question it is a foul. (A.R. 9-1-2-XV).

9-1-3 (FR-120) (Replaces 9-1-2-I, m, n) Initiating Contact/Targeting an Opponent

a. No player shall initiate contact and target an opponent with the crown (top) of his helmet. When in question, it is a foul.
b. No player shall initiate contact and target a defenseless opponent above the

shoulders. When in question, it is a foul. (Refer to Points of Emphasis for a description of "Defenseless Player.")
PENALTY (a-b)—Personal Foul. 15 yards basic spot, or 15 yards from the

succeeding spot for dead-ball fouls. Also, automatic first down for fouls by Team B if not in conflict with other rules. (Exception: Penalties for offensive team personal fouls behind the neutral zone are enforced from the previous spot. Safety if the foul occurs behind Team A's goal line) [S7, S24, S34, S38, S39, S40, S41, S45 or S46]. Flagrant offenders shall be disqualified [S47]. Note 1: If the ball carrier is judged down by rule and the Instant Replay

Official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which player recovers the

fumble, the ruling of down-by-rule stands.

Note 2: If the ruling of down-by-rule is reversed, the ball belongs to the recovering player at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.

Article 4. No other plays or officiating decisions are reviewable. However, the Instant Replay Official may correct egregious errors. This excludes fouls that are not specifically reviewable (Reviewable fouls: Rules 12-3-2-e, f and 12-3-3-f, g).

12-5-1-b-1 (FR-148)

(Replace second sentence with the following)

If a head coach's challenge is successful he retains the challenge, which he may use only once more during the game. Thus a coach may have a total of two challenges if and only if his initial challenge is successful.
